

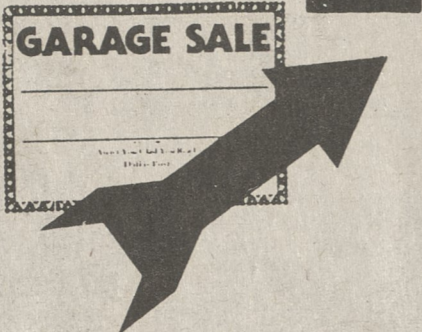

School Board President Joseph "Red" Jones announced recently that 3 members of the Lake-Lehman professional staff made presentations at the 23rd Annual Fall Conference of the Pennsylvania Association of School Administrators (PASA). The conference was held in Allentown from Sept. 29 - Oct. 1. Jones received notification in a letter from PASA President-elect William C. Snyder. In it, Snyder announced that Dr. M. David Preston, Lake-Lehman Superintendent, made a presentation on "A Jointly Operated Staff Development Program." Preston

Lake-Lehman schools recognized

will explain the implementation of "Project Excellence," a 3 phase consortium effort initiated jointly by the Lake-Lehman and Dallas School Districts. This project served as a springboard to individualized staff development projects based upon the effective schools-effective teaching research of Dr. Madeline Hunter, Dr. Ernie Stackowski, Jane Stallings, Larry Lezotte, and other noted educational specialists. Robert Kunkle, principal in the Lake-Noxen Elementary School, made a presentation entitled, "A Model Pre-School-Early Education Program." This program is an attempt by the Lake-Lehman School District to bring parents and their pre-schoolers into the schools together for a few presentations on such topics as physical wellness,

nutrition, reading readiness, orientation to the full-time kindergarten program, and parent effectiveness. While the parents attend workshops, the pre-schoolers visit actual kindergarten classrooms for a story hour. Kunkle explained how the program works and how it has been instrumental in the success of Lake-Lehman's full day kindergarten program. Kathryn Gregory, whose "Accelerated Earth and Space Science Program" was chosen in 1984 as a National Exemplar by the National Science Teachers' Association, appeared at the conference to outline the objectives and explain the program's content. The course is unique because it concentrates on the local environment with little attention being paid to other sections of the country. The theory behind this approach is that the skills learned from investigating local environment first-hand would be applicable to any region regardless of geologic differences. Ms. Gregory teaches this course to eighth graders at the Lake-Lehman Junior High School. Kunkle, Ms. Gregory, and Dr. Preston were chosen as presentors "...because of the quality of their programs and the timeliness of their topics." Snyder commended the Lake-Lehman School District for their willingness to share these innovative programs with other schools across the state.

Project approved

U.S. Rep. Paul E. Kanjorski, (D-PA) recently announced the Veterans Administration has approved a construction project for the VA Medical Center in Wilkes-Barre. Nearly \$2 million will serve to renovate the 10th floor of the facility for use as an alcohol treatment nursing unit. "This renovation will greatly improve the quality of treatment for patients while providing for proper maintenance of building operations as well," Kanjorski noted. Renovations plans include upgrading mechanical, electrical and fire safety systems. According to a tentative construction schedule issued by the Administrator of Veterans Affairs, an architectural contract will be announced this November, followed by a construction contract award in February. The newly funded project is expected to take three years to complete.
