THE NORTHEAST PENNSYLVANIA CHAPTER of the American Heart Association will conduct a Basic Cardiac Life Support Instructor Certification Course on Oct. 26-27 at the Learning Center of the NPW Medical Center in Wilkes-Barre.

A prerequisite for enrollment into the course is a current Basic Life Support Provider card from the Heart Association, the American Red Cross or EMT.

Successful completion of the course will enable an individual to teach Cardio-pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). Prior to enrollment, interested applicants are required to complete a Skills Performance Testing Session, which will be held on Thursday, Oct. 17 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. in the Basement Conference Room of the Kirby Health Center in Wilkes-Barre.

The Skills Testing Session is a mini-course review, which includes one and two rescuer CPR, infant resuscitation and management of infant and adult obstructed airway.

The Instructor Certification Course will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 26, and from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. on the following day.

The fee for the Skills Performance Testing Session and the Instructor Certification Course is \$15 per person and reimbursement will be granted to candidates who do not complete the Skills Testing Session.

Registration deadline is October 14 and enrollment is limited to 30.

THE REGIONAL COMPUTER RESOURCE CENTER at Wilkes College, in conjunction with Apple Computer, Inc. will sponsor a conference entitled, "Microcomputers for K-12: Instruction and Administration", on Tuesday, Oct. 15 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Stark Learning Center, Room 101.

Clinics

THE FREE CLINIC for screening for cancer of the breast and cervix has moved from the Mercy Medical Arts Building to the Maternal and Family Health Services Building, 37 North River Street, Wilkes-Barre.

This service is for women who have not had a pap smear in three years or more, or who meet income guidelines. The clinic offers a free pap test and breast examination as well as teaching self breast examination to all eligible women.

Luzerne County is among the top 10 percent in the nation for cancer mortalities. Women of all ages are encouraged to call for this free examination. Early detection is the primary method for cancer control and cure. Over 100 women have been screened since the program began earlier this year.

The clinic is administered by Maternal and Family Health Services through a contract with the Pennsylvania Department of Health. Specially trained nurse clinicians administer all tests. Positive

results are sent to the patient's physician for further diagnosis and treatment if needed.

All tests are by appointment only and can be scheduled by calling 822-7591.

Ferguson in concert

The famous jazz trumpeter Maynard Ferguson and his band will appear in a free concert on Thursday, Oct. 10, at 8 p.m., in Walsh Auditorium atg College Misericordia.

Ferguson, best known for the smash hit "Gonna Fly Now" theme from the movie "Rocky" also recorded the jazz rock hit "MacArthur Park." The iron-lipped, high-blast master is noted for his rare ability to play in the upper reaches of his instrument with amazing power and clarity.

The famed trumpeter, who sold more albums than any other band-

leader since the 40s, has been delighting generations of jazz enthusiasts. From the earliest days Ferguson's bands have bred solo artist and his alumni list reads like a "Who's Who" in Jazz: Chick Corea, Bob James, Bill Chase, Chuch Mangione, Slide Hampton, Don Ellis, Willie Maiden, Wayne Shorter, Peter Erskine and many more.

Ferguson is now in his fourth decade as leader with all new band featuring horns, percussion, guitars, keyboards, bass and drums. Their latest album, "Live from San Francisco," is a solid mix of jazz standards and contemporary pop music.
