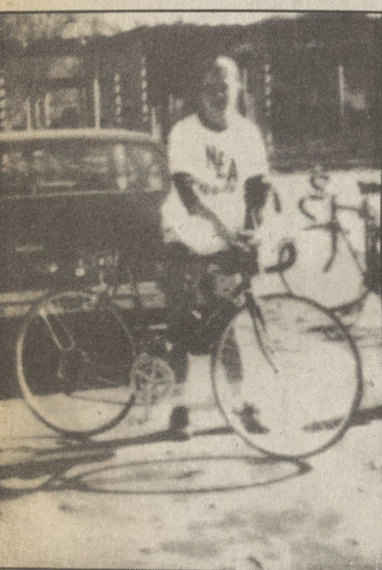
Officers installed

Chairman named
