

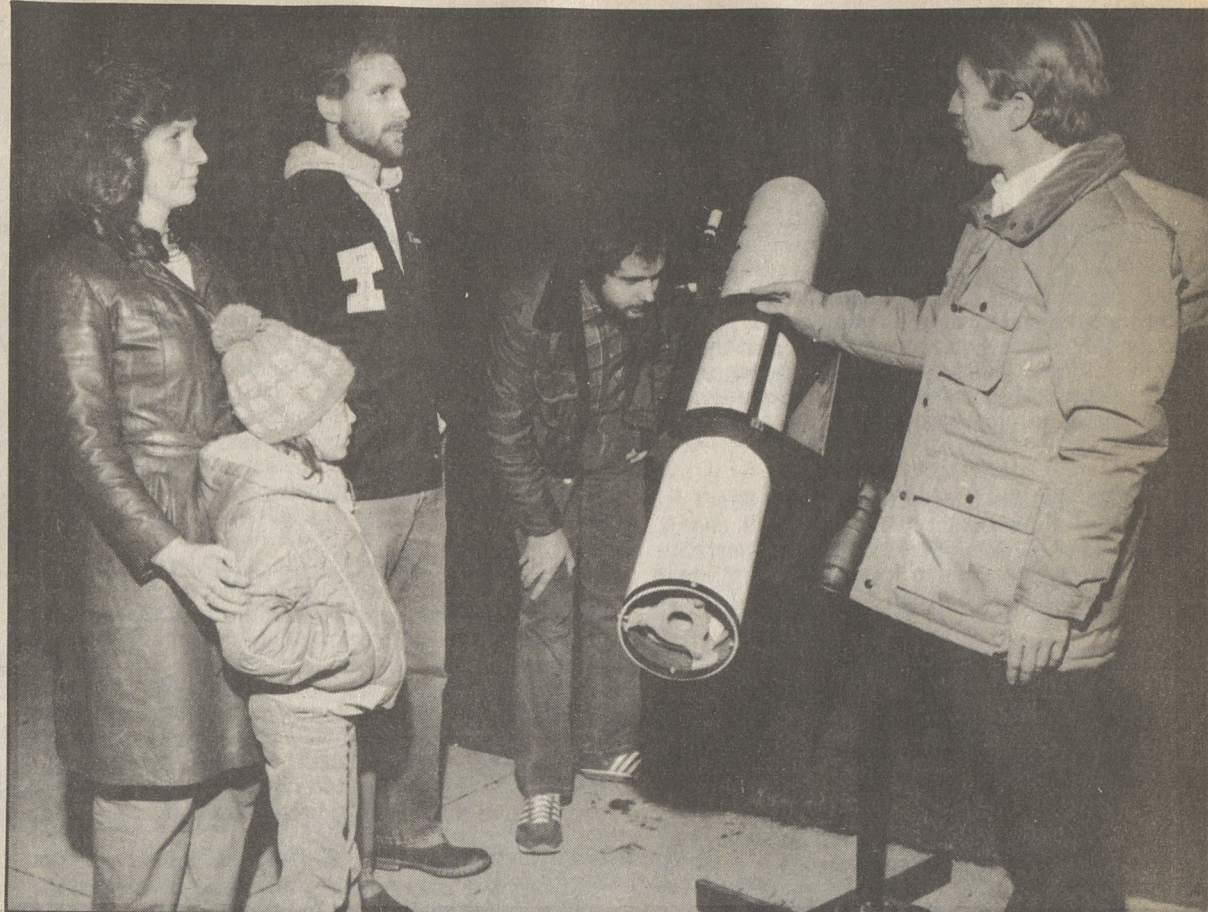

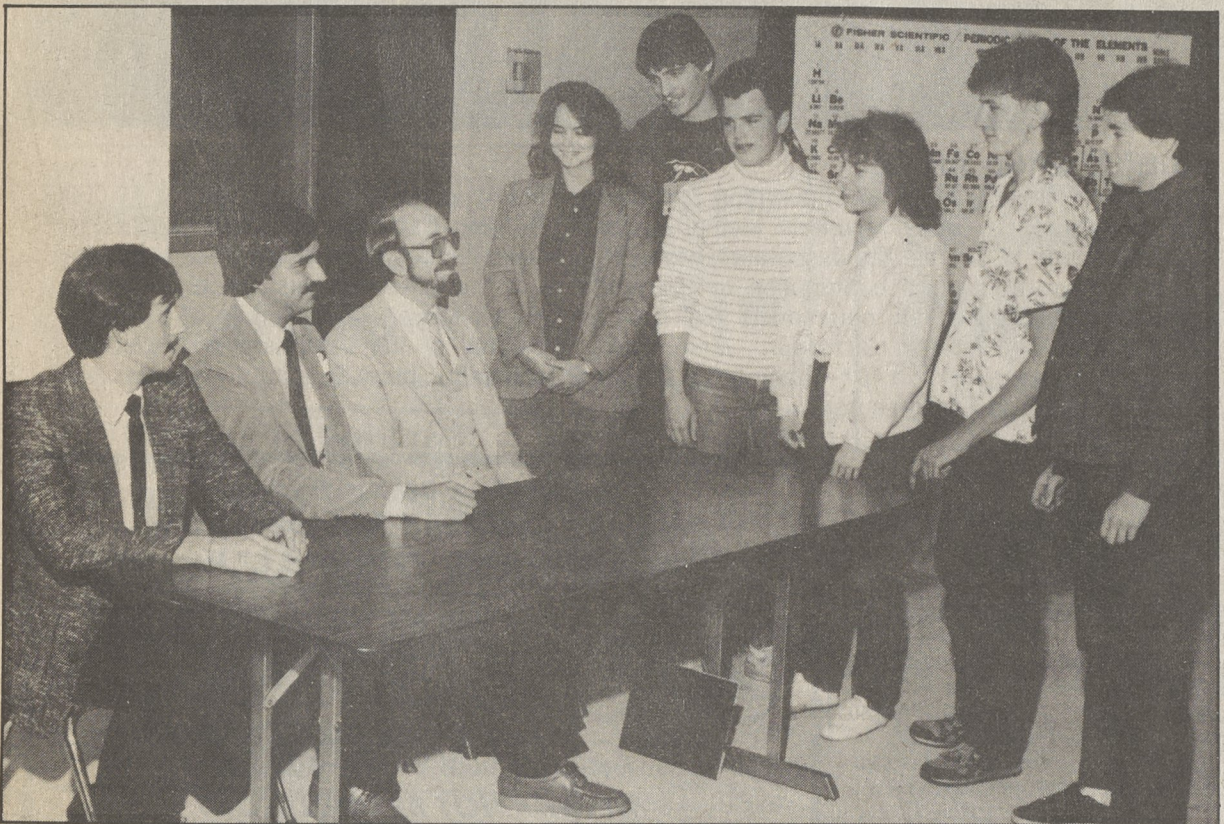
NEDT given

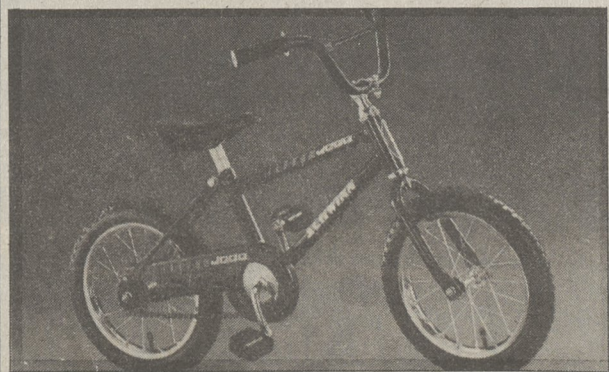
Data being collected

The Census Bureau has begun collecting data here on changes in buying habits, according to LaVerne Collins, director of the Census Bureau's Philadelphia regional office.

The Census Bureau will be conducting the Consumer Expenditure Surveys in this area each month for the Bureau of Labor Statistics to update its "market basket" of goods and services, used in the Consumer Price Index. This index measures changes in the purchasing power of the dollar over a month, a year or several years.

Households are asked to participate in either the Consumer Expenditure Quarterly Interview or the Diary Survey. Those participating in the Quarterly Interview Survey are asked to furnish data on large purchases such as cars, household furnishings and utilities.

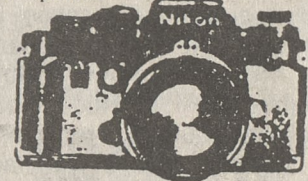

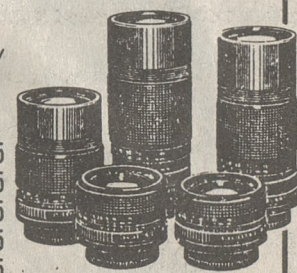
