To be a visually-oriented safe driver, the POA advises the follow-

-Give yourself access to the total visual field by having windows clear of snow, ice and fog. Auto air conditioners will clear car windows of inside moisture within a few minutes even in winter.


-Help others to see you, particularly at dusk by turning on headlights and keeping them clean. The contrast between sky brightness and road darkness at dusk makes seeing difficult resulting in 6 p.m. being the most common time for fatal


