

Dallas grapplers even slate

After losing a close 35-21 meet to the Meyers Mohawks, the Dallas High School wrestlers ran their record to 2-2, Friday night, by coasting by West Side Titans 44-17.

The Dallas Mountaineers used four pins and two forfeits in defeating the game Titans. The first four matmen started the ball rolling for Dallas with 98-lb. Jim O'Donnell pinning Brian Maguski in 3:10 and 105-lb. Brian Mather flattening Devin Mays in 27 se ds. 112-lb. Paul Burke picked six more points for the Mountaineers on a forfeit, and 119-lb. Eric Olsen wrestled to a 4-4 draw with the Titans John Hopkins for two points giving Dallas a 20-0 score.

In a close bout, 126 Bill Janosky took an early 4-2 lead over Titan Bill Bower but late in the third period the Titan pulled a reversal and a near fall to win 6-5 to give West Side three points. His 132-lb. brother, Rich Bower added three more points to the Titans score, making it 20-8, by taking a close 3-2 bout from Mountaineer Mike Rich-

Richards used a takedown in the first period to take the lead but Bower came back with a takedown in the second period to tie up the bout. The grapplers battled for the lead with the break going to Bower when he managed to escape in the closing seconds of the third period to earn a 3-2 decision.

With Dallas leading 20-8, 138-lb. Brian Maseychik moved Dallas to 26 when he won on a default by Titan Tom Feeney. Maseychik was leading 6-2 in the bout when Feeney defaulted due to an injury.

145-lb. Gene Faulls moved the Mountaineers to a 32-8 lead by turning over Mark Senchak in 1:08 but the Titans picked up three points on 155-lb. Paul Feeney's 7-1 win over young Mount Dave Cooper.

Dallas' Dale Williams got the second fastest fall of the evening when he clamped 167-lb. John Spencer in 33 seconds and 185-lb. Chris Vincelli got six additional points for the Mountaineers on a forfeit.

With the Mountaineers leading 44-11, Coach Larry Schuler did not send a heavyweight out and the Titans added six points on the Dallas forfeit to the Titan's Harry

185-lb. Chris Vincelli took a 6-1 decision from Mohawk Jeff Dumble but Hwt. Bill Edwards proved too much for Mountaineer Tom Schact, pinning him in 1:01.

The Mohawks clinched the meet in the final four bouts by taking three of them, two by pins and one by a decision.


