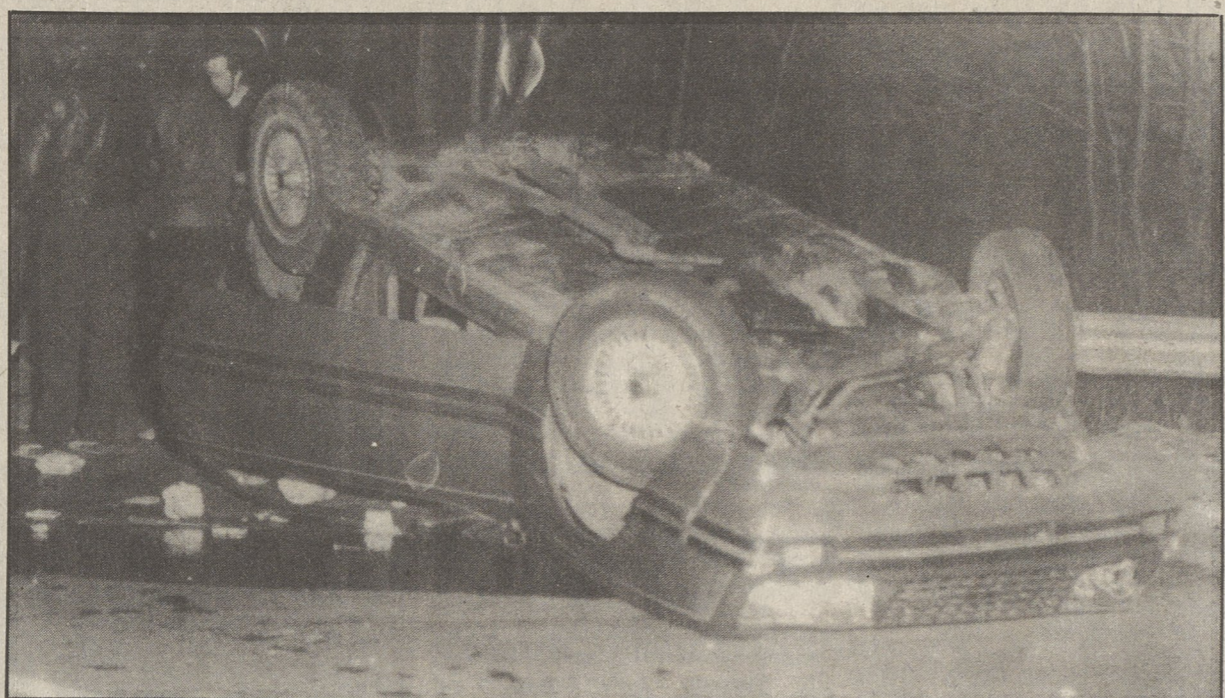

Youths injured

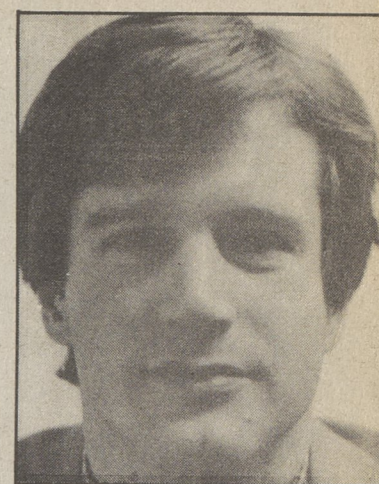
Hoinski joins Post
