1986 license now required

Anglers are reminded that a 1986 fishing license is now required. As of January 1, the new license, the only one required for fishing within the Commonwealth, is good for the entire calendar year.

Prices remain the same as last year. A resident license cost \$12, and a resident senior (over 65 years of age) is \$2. A nonresident license is \$20, and a resident tourist (seven consecutive days) costs \$15.

Licenses are available throughout the state at over 1,700 issuing agents, at county treasurers offices, or any office of the Pennsylvania Fish Commission. A 50-cent issuing agents fee is charged for each license.

1986 promises to offer excellent fishing opportunities within the Commonwealth. The price of a license allows fishing to be one of the least expensive sports to be found.

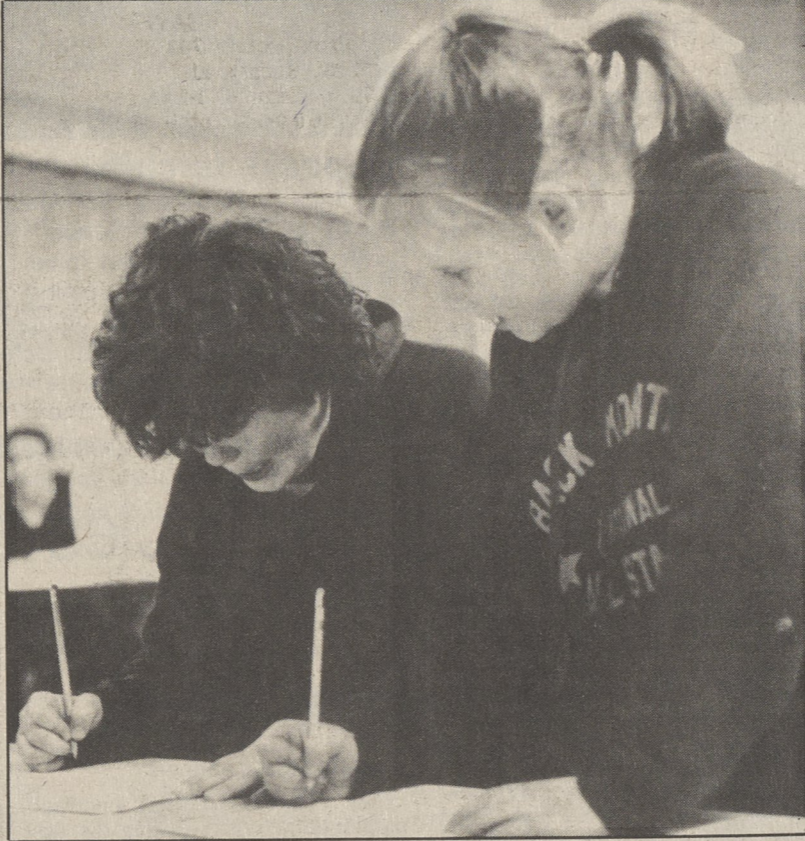

Bridget signs up

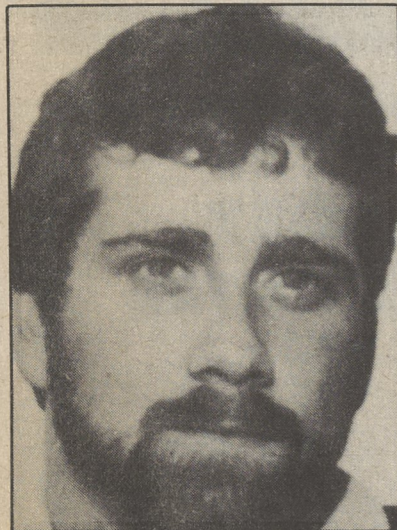
