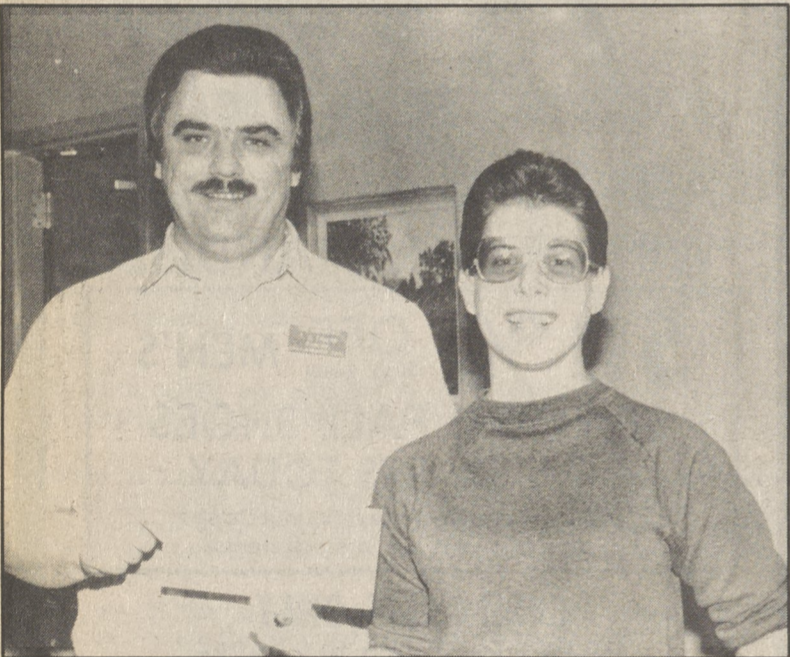
An evening dinner reception was held at St. Michael's Hall, Hanover Twp.

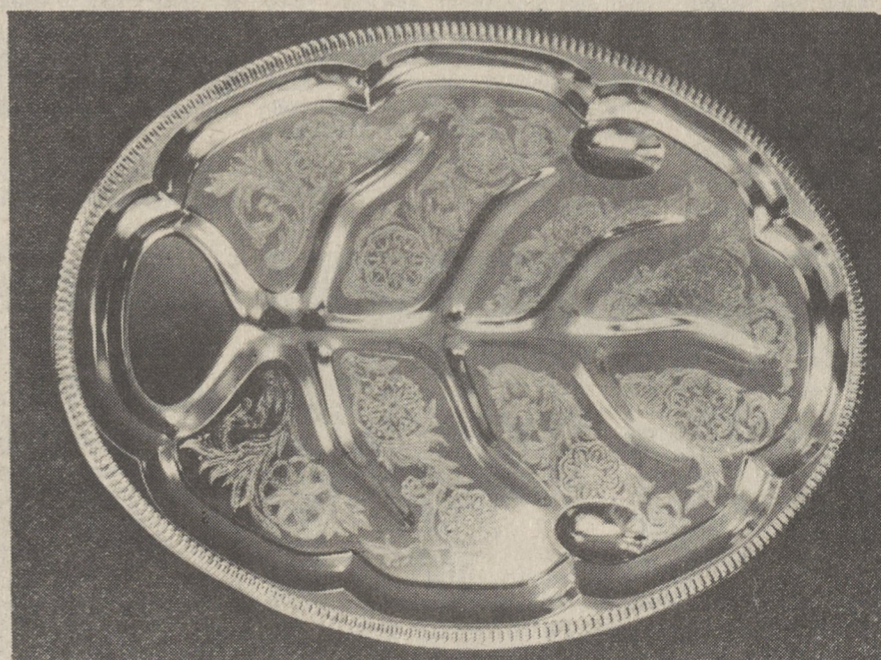

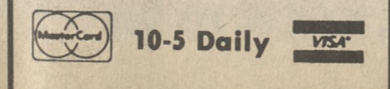
