Dr. James C. Dobson is a leading Christian psychologist who has served for 14 years with the University of Southern California as associate clinical professor of pediatrics and 17 years on the attending staff of Children's Hospital in Los Angeles. He was appointed by President Reagan in 1982 to serve for four years on the National Advisory Committee for Juvenile Justice and Delinquency.

Dobson has authored such books as "Dare to Discipline", "The Strong-Willed Child", and "Emotions - Can You Trust Them?"

Upcoming film dates are: Feb. 16 - "The Family Under Fire-Pornography and Abortion Issues;" Feb. 23 - "Overcoming a Painful Childhood," featuring Shirley, the wife of Dr. Dobson; and March 2 - "The Heritage."
