### Wilkes plans Central European tour

The Wilkes College Division of Continuing Education is offering a Central European cultural study tour which will provide participants with the opportunity to learn about the countries of Austria, West Germany and Switzerland first-hand. Edelweiss, as the tour is called, will run from July 24 to August 10, 1986, under the escort of Dr. Charlotte Lord, Professor Emerita, and Dr. Walter Karpnich, Associate Professor of Language and Literature at Wilkes College.

Edelweiss will focus on a variety of cultural centers in Central Europe. The trip's itinerary includes stops in Vienna and Salzburg in Austria; Munich, Heidelberg and Rothenburg in West Germany; and Lucerne in Switzerland. Among the special events planned

for the trip are a full-day excursion to Nuremberg, an operetta performance in Vienna, a concert at Salzburg, and visits to Neuschwanstein and Linderhof Castles. The cost of the trip will include roundtrip air travel from New York to Zurich and

Vienna via Swissair, all hotel-airport transfers, lodging at first-class hotels, breakfast and dinner daily, private motorcoach facilities throughout central Europe and guided tours at all points of the itinerary.
