Mr. Daubert, also is a graduate of Dallas High School, is employed by Royer Foundry and Machine Co., Kingston.

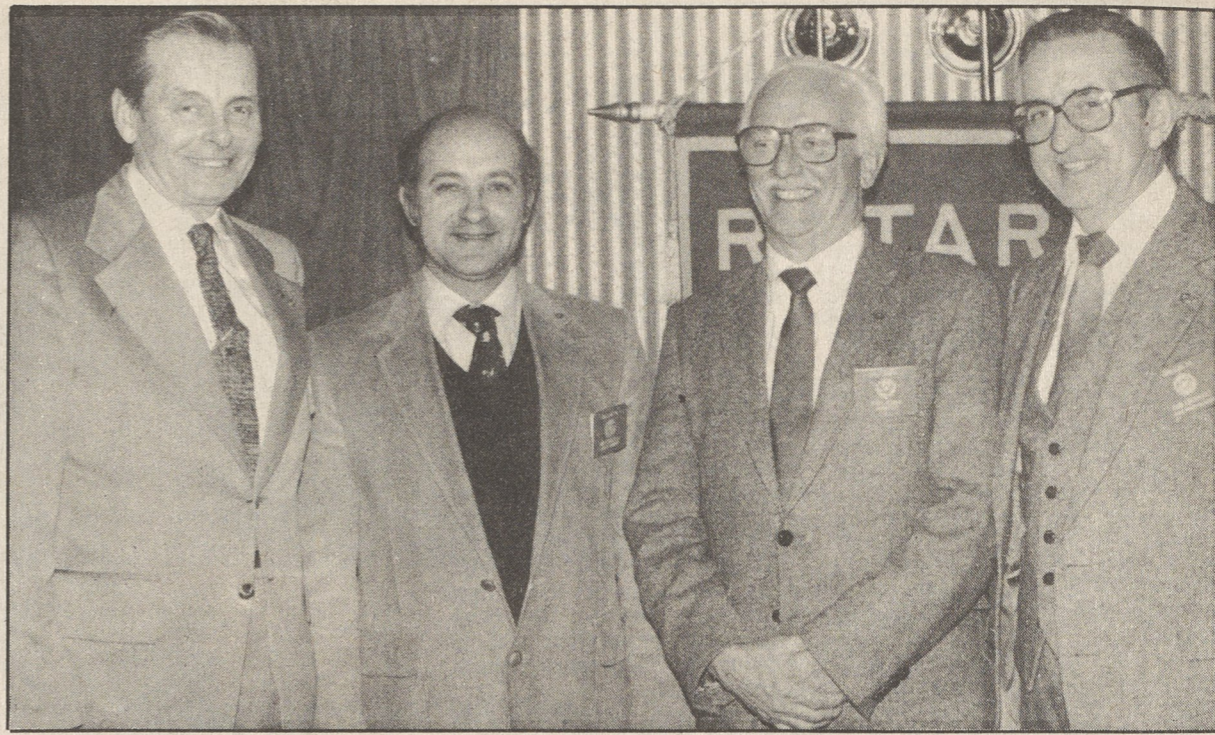
The wedding will take place September 13 in Slocum Chapel, Exeter.
