Teaching nursery school truly has its own rewards!

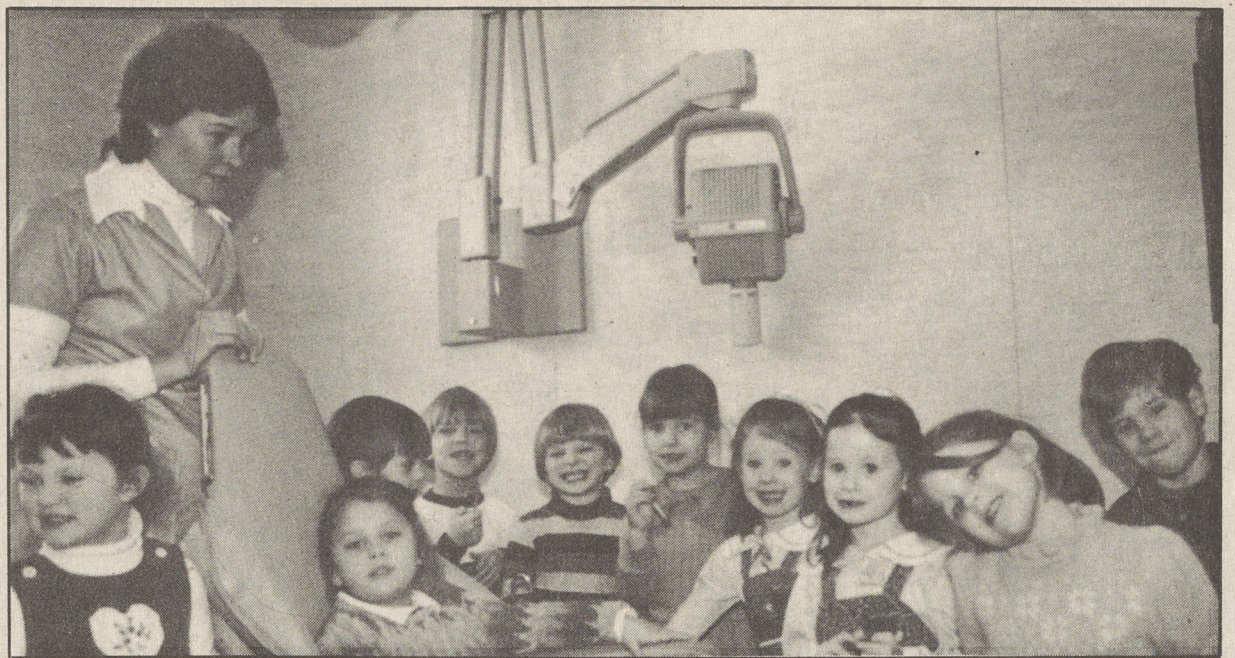

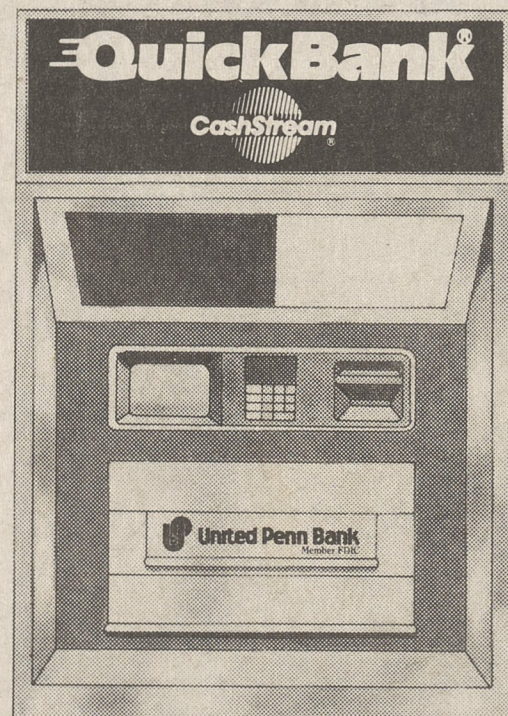
