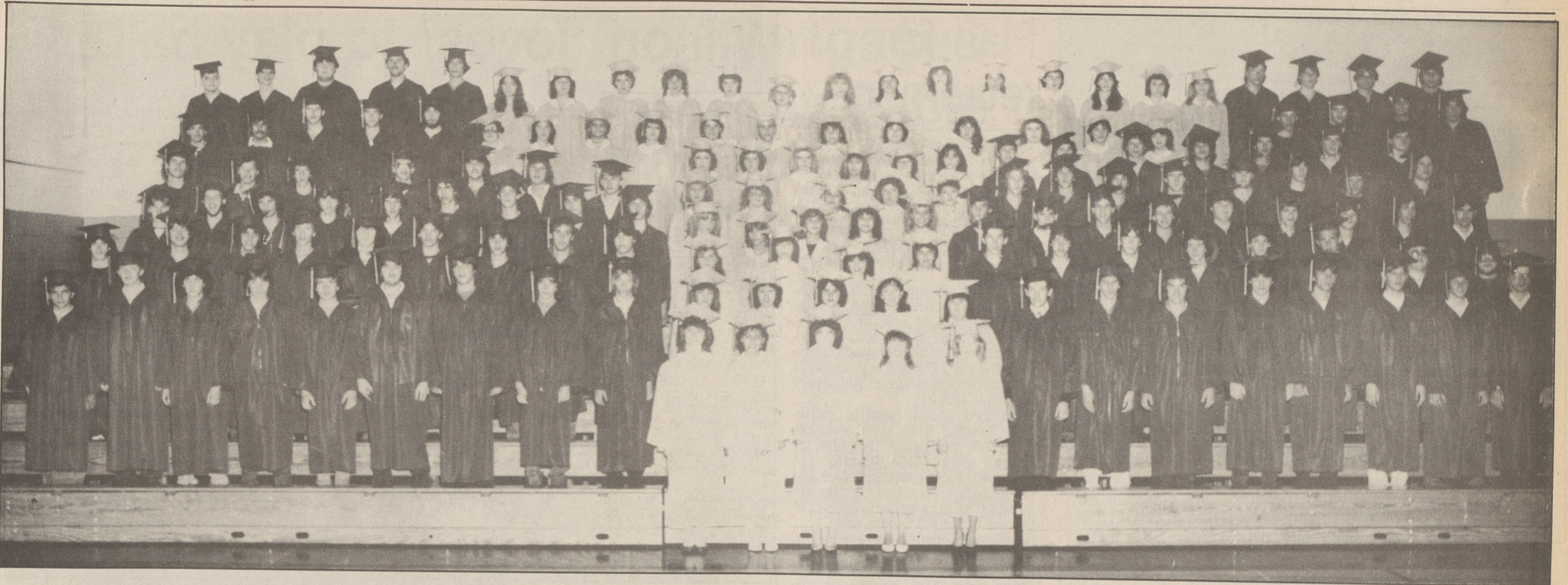


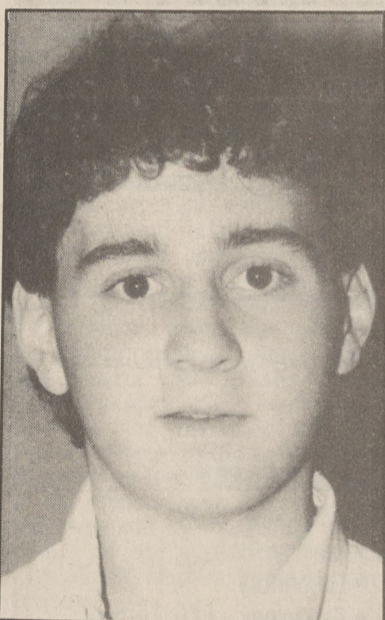

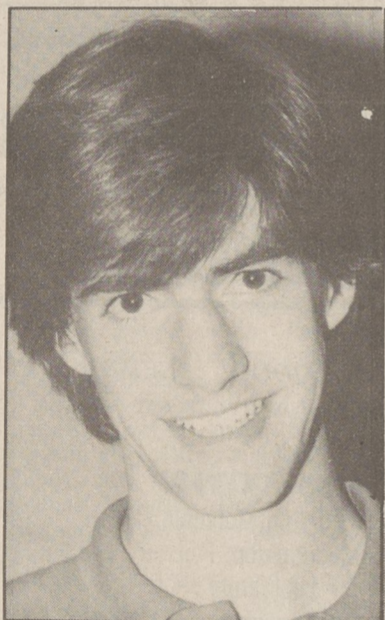
Tech graduates

The four students are attending the Leadership Camp at Keystone Junior College which began on June 15 and will continue through to June 19.

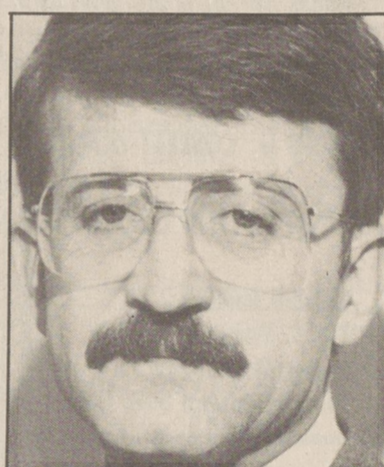
Murphy named to program
