Residents reminded of ordinance

Kingston Township Zoning Officer Ralph R. Anthony, Jr., reminds township residents of the Township Ordinance pertaining to high weed growth. The Zoning Officer advises that it is unlawful to allow weeds or vegetation to grow on a property in excess of six (6) inches. Further such vegetation or growth may not throw off any unpleasant or noxious odor, or conceal any filthy deposit or create a pollen problem.

Any vegetation grown for edible or ornamental purposes is excluded from this act.

All property owners, according to Mr. Anthony, are responsible for keeping their properties neat and trim in accordance with this ordinance.

Mr. Anthony advises that complaints regarding high weeds are investigated by his office. Following an investigation, if a violation is detected, the property owner is served with a certified letter and copy of the weed ordinance.
