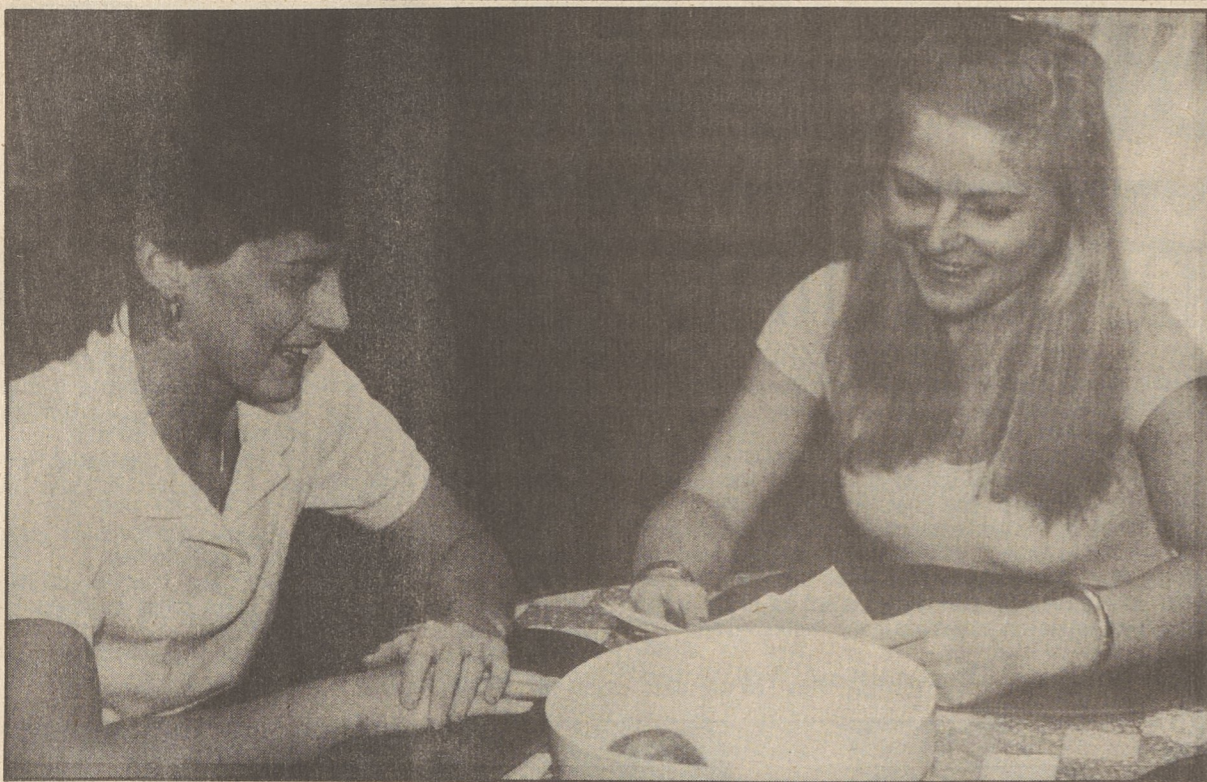

BUFFALO WINGS

2 1/2 lbs. wings (split at joint & tipped)
4 T. Red Hot (or more to taste)
1/4 c. butter or margarine, melted

Deep fry wings at 400 degrees until crispy, remove and drain. Combine Red Hot and butter, toss wings in the mixture to coat completely. Serve with blue cheese dressing.

BAKED BEANS

2 16-oz. cans butter beans
3/4 c. brown sugar
1 t. dry mustard
1/2 c. catsup
Bacon strips

Mix all ingredients together in greased two-quart casserole. Cover with bacon strips. Bake at 325 degrees 1 1/2-2 hours.

SALAMI PEEK-A-BOOS

8-oz. cream cheese, softened
2 t. Dijon mustard
25 slices hard salami, cut in halves
25 sweet pickles, cut in halves crosswise

Combine cream cheese and mustard. Spread each piece of salami with about 1 1/2 t. of cream cheese mixture. Place a pickle half at one short end of each piece of salami and roll up. The pickle should peek out of the rounded edge of the salami. Cover and refrigerate until serving time. Makes 50.

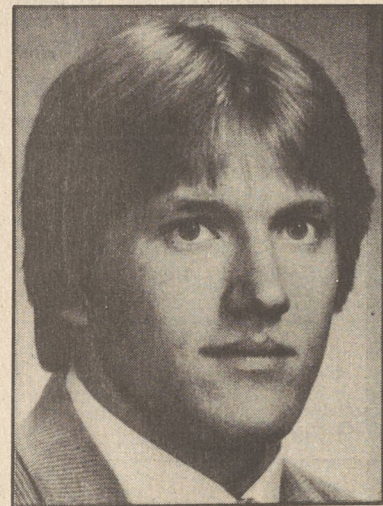
