

TWENTY-THREE LOCAL RESI-**DENTS** are among 37 students currently earning college credits prior to beginning their freshman year of study through the College Entry Program at King's College.

The program, open to students at a college or university in the fall, is designed to allow students an opportunity to either refine basic skills needed in their freshman year of study or to accelerate their studies by completing courses in the summer, enabling them to take a reduced courseload while they adjust to the academic demands of college.

Students enrolled in the program are participating in classes in the areas of critical thinking, writing, math, study, skills, quantitive reasoning and theatre.
