TWO BACK MOUNTAIN RESIDENTS are among 26 Wilkes College students who will attend professional programs this fall in the areas of medicine, pharmacy, dentistry, podiatry, optometry and physical therapy. Their acceptances into the programs were announced recently by Dr. Ralph Rozelle, Dean of Health Sciences at Wilkes College.

Lisa Mikulis, of Shavertown, will enter the University of Health Sciences, Kansas City Osteopathic Medicine; while John Handley, a resident of Dallas, will enter the University of Maryland Dental School.
