Conway's picks Computer system uses fans' knowledge

It should be known from the outset that no system can predict the outcome of a football game precisely.

The Conway Computer System provides the fan with basic estimates which is better known as the "Instant Pre Play." Thus, the Conway System encourages the fan to draw on his own knowledge of the game and employ his own judgement in weighing all the influencing factors which will enable the fan to derive greater overall pleasure and satisfaction for the upcoming season.

++Key to understanding computerized predictions:

A) The pint differential is only to be used as a handicap...(against the line)

B) Star picks only indicate substantial points between the computer and the line.

C) Super picks or locks occur when the computer indicates a minus situation and the line indicates a positive situation.

+Conway's 1986 Computerized College & Pro Predictions:

August 27th:

Star picks for week 1:
Ohio State vs. Alabama: Alabama is rated no. 5 in my top ten...yet if 'Bama has any thoughts of being no. 1 this year, they should beat Ohio State by at least nine points. (+++Game) give the 3-3½ points away.

Florida State vs. Toledo: Florida State will do a number on Toledo. If the line is under 14 points Florida State is a 10 star game - If the line is from 15 to 21 it's a three after that stay away.

South Carolina vs. Miami (Fla.): Miami should win this game by ten or more points. Give up anything less than 10 points and you have a 10 star game on your hands.

Pittsburgh vs. Maryland: This game will probably go off as a pick! The computer has Pitt by three because Pitt's home. This is a no star game. Pitt should beat the Terps by 14 points but no one knows just which Pitt will come to play? Grab a few cold ones and put your feet up.

Different ways to read and achieve success with the Conway system:

When the spread indicates a line lower than the Computer's Prediction, we find a high degree of success, yet the rule of thumb is no less than four points and no more than ten points for this to be effective.

The other trick is to find the reverse play from the Computer against the Line. A good example would be when the Computer indicates Penn State to win by 5 yet the Line is Pitt -11. This is a reverse of six points and when this occurs this system is on fire. The rule of thumb in this case is no less than six points and no more than ten points.

Fifth annual triathlon drawing top athletes

What started five years ago with a field of less than 150 participants, the Greater Wilkes-Barre Triathlon, formerly the Wyoming Valley-Back Mountain Triathlon, has grown to the point where this year's event will include the No. 1 triathlete in the world.

Scott Molina of Boulder, Colo., will head a contingent of approximately 100 professional triathletes in this year's 5th Annual event which will also include Liz Bulman from Columbia, Missouri, winner of the recent Chicago triathlon, the largest in terms of numbers of such events.

"We thought if we could attract 40 professionals this year we would have done fantastically well," Jerry Kowalski, Race Director, said. "But when Scott Molina and Liz Bulman confirmed they were coming, the

field of professionals entering just mushroomed. We already have 95 pros coming."

The race, which will begin at Harvey's Lake at 8 a.m. on Sunday, is expected to draw 500 men and women from across the Northeast, the Mid-Atlantic states and other parts of the nation and Canada.

"We had 140 people participate in our first year," Kowalski noted. "Many of them were local athletes. But now we have a good deal of people in the age groups coming in from all over; New York State, Virginia, Georgia, Vermont. It's amazing."

The race will also be taking on a new look this year, being split into the open (professional) division and the Age Group Divisions, and for the first time cash prizes will be awarded in the open bracket.

First place winners in the male and female groups will each receive a \$5,000 cash prize while the top

male and female finishers in the Masters class, a subdivision of the open bracket, will each receive a \$400 cash prize. Overall, athletes will be competing for \$24,350 in cash and other awards.

The winner of the event, which will also serve as a qualifier for 30 athletes for the Triathlon Federation-USA National International Course Championship at Hilton Head, South Carolina, will be declared the Pennsylvania State Triathlon Champion.

The race will begin at 8 a.m. on Sunday with a 1.5 kilometer swim at the Harvey's Lake Beach Association.

The second leg of the event will consist of a 40 kilometer bike race commencing from the lake through Kunkle, Beaumont, Vernon and Centermoreland, winding up at College Misericordia. A 10 kilometer run beginning and ending at the College will conclude the race.

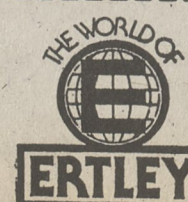

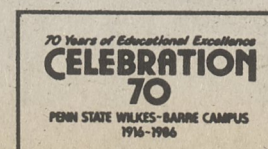
