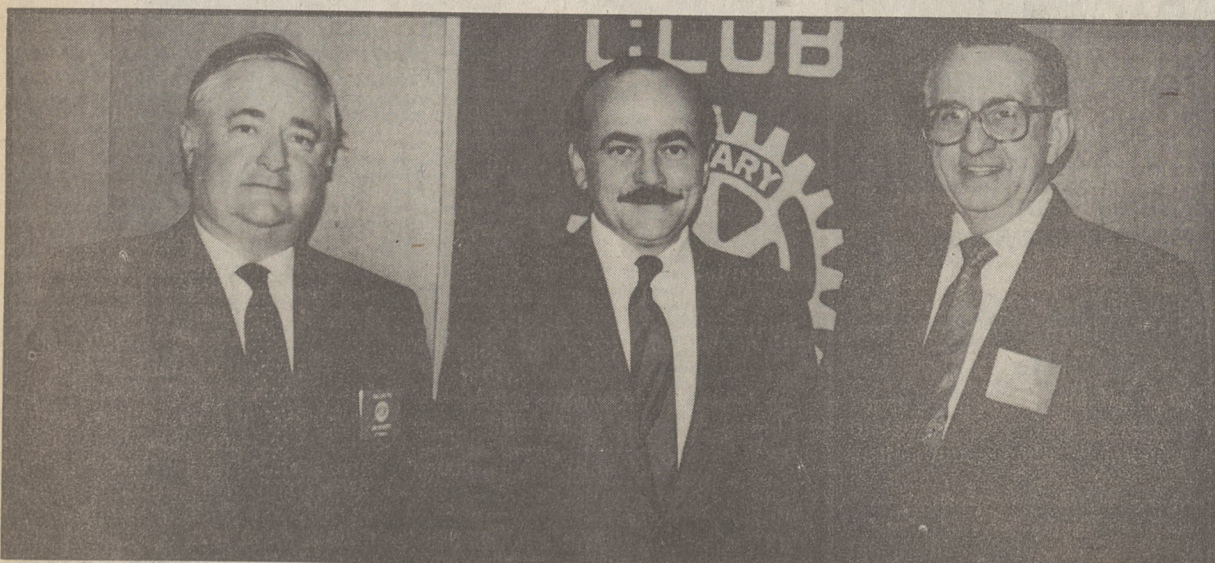
DSH Seniors should get photos taken by Aug. 30
