Departure times from the fairgrounds are 2:30, 4:30, 6:30, 7, 7:30, 8:30, 9:30 and 11 p.m. The fee will be \$1 each way and no Senior Citizen Cards, Half-fare Cards, Fare Deal Tickets, Twenty Saver Tickets and Transfers will be accepted as a fare.

The 18th annual Luzerne County Fair will be held Wednesday through Sunday following Labor Day. Each year thousands of people attend the Luzerne County Fair to see hundreds of exhibits including livestock, 4-H, arts & crafts, commer-

cial and this year for the first time horses will be on show, over 30 food concessions, five days of entertainment including Boxcar Willie who will open the fair; and thrill rides by S & S Amusements.

Admission for the fair will be increased for Wednesday to \$3. Admission will include opening night entertainment by Boxcar Willie with the Texas Trainmen. Tuesday through Sunday, gate admission will be \$2. Parking will remain \$1 for each night.

The Luzerne County Transportation Authority will provide bus transportation to the 1986 Luzerne County Fair, Sept. 3 to 7.

The special buses will depart from Sheraton Crossgates on Public Square, Wilkes-Barre and stop at Kingston Corners; Main & Bennett Street, Luzerne; Carverton Road, Trucksville; Shavertown Shopping Center; Dallas Shopping Center; and the Fair Grounds. Departure times from Public Square are 1:30, 3:30, 5:30, 6:30, and 8:30 Wednesday through Sunday.

- b) Before signing any binding document, contact a funeral director of your choice for additional counseling as well as comparative price information. The Federal Trade Commission requires all funeral homes to make service and merchandise prices available to any interested parties.
