Morgantini said there were some good kids at West Side Vo-Tech who wanted to play football, so when Coach Ray McNulty resigned, he decided to apply for the position.


Morgantini resides with his wife, the former Susan Root, and two children in Harding.

They must have developed enough basic skills in their class work to qualify for entry level employment.
