Two more businesses to open

Under construction along Route 415, Dallas is a new car wash designed and built by James Veras Construc-

The large building with three entrances and three exits is similar to the car wash constructed by Veras along Route 309 in Trucksville, in July, 1983.

Veras said the increased demand for car washing facilities in the Back Mountain prompted him to build the second one in Dallas. He selected the Dallas location in order to make it more convenient for car owners in the Dallas, Harveys Lake and Lake-Lehman areas of the Back Mountain.

Both the Trucksville business and the business presently under construction are owned and managed by the Veras Corporation.

The target date for completion of the Dallas facility

is November of this year.

Along Route 309, near the Hanover Bank, Dallas Office, the Hoagie Bar, purchased recently by Robert Mines from John George is undergoing renovations and will open soon as MaMa Juiliani's Pasta House, a division of Minotti's Subs.

The opening date of the new restaurant, the first of its kind in the Back Mountain, is tentatively set for November 1. It will be family-owned and managed and will feature homemade Italian food at affordable prices for residents of the area.

It will be operated according to Mines' slogan, "Growing with the Community and You."

Mines will continue to conduct his business "Minotti's" located in the 309-415 Plaza, across from the Dallas Shopping Center.
