Denmon pulls way ahead of pack

It was a topsy-turvy week for The Dallas Post prognosticators this past week but Charlot Denmon picked up another three victories to pull way out in front of her counterparts with a 40-10 slate. Denmon was right on the money in the Crestwood-Bishop O'Reilly Game, the Dallas-Nanticoke game and the Pittsburgh-Navy game.

Two games which stumped Denmon and her opponents were the Wyoming Seminary-Williamson game which saw the Knights of Seminary drop their first contest in 19 outings by a baseball-like score of 3-2 and the Penn State-Alabama game where the Nittany Lions crushed their opponents, 23-3.

All six prognosticators got the Crestwood-O'Reilly game right where the Comets picked up a 32-8 victory while John Oliver and GoalPOST Petie were stumped when the Mountaineers of

Dallas squeaked by Nanticoke 15-12.

This week, the prognosticators are split on the Bishop O'Hara-Bishop O'Reilly game while the Mountaineers of Dallas get the nod over Bishop Hoban. The Crestwood-Lehman game also has the six crew members scratching their heads with some going for the Black Knights and others going with the Comets.

Penn State is a shoe-in over West Virginia as is Pitt over Syracuse and Notre Dame over Navy. Wyoming Seminary is expected to climb back into the win column with a victory over Perkiomen.
