can expand back here, too.

"Secondly, in the environmental area, it is important that we improve the appearance of roadways and our recreation attractions," Bilbow continued. "I've always been an advocate of the 'bottle bill' that would offer a deposit on certain containers.

"I know Lemmond wasn't in favor of it initially, but after his camp took a survey he found that 89 per cent of the people want the bill," Bilbow added. "Now, thankfully, he is for it. There is a problem with expense and space involving landfills, so we have to reduce solid waste hauling and create economic incentives for recycling.

"Through recycling, I think we could reduce solid waste

dumping by 15 to 25 percent. And then we must reduce it from there. European countries send only five per cent of their solid waste to landfills. That tells you something about recycling."

On that same environmental level, Bilbow also talked about correcting the quality of water in the Back Mountain, which has been a source of irritation to some, in addition to the third phase of his campaign.

"On the educational front, Pennsylvania ranks 48th or 50th in state funding for higher education," he stated. "We have to develop programs to meet the educational needs of the times. We have the 'seeds' with fine learning institutions in the valley, but we must fund, target and stimulate attitudes and train people here."

In a broader sense, reverting back to the overall picture, Kanjorski said that, as a result of the work he and other officials have been doing over the past two years, he would not be surprised if a few companies make announcements soon about locating in the area.

Kanjorski and Holtzman have been waging an intense one-on-one battle in anticipation of their Nov. 4 showdown. Holtzman, the young Republican from Kingston, ran unopposed in the May primary to automatically advance to the final round.

It seems their purpose is to represent a group of investors whose desire it is to retail funeral merchandise to the public outside of the licensed funeral director who is operating a funeral home. While it is perfectly legal under the laws of Pennsylvania for an organization to do so, this same group may not be in a position to render the associated services as well as the care, understanding, and counseling necessary at the time of need.

Should you be contacted by a representative of such an organization, we urge the following:

- a) Refrain from hasty or impulsive purchase for the purpose of taking advantage of alleged bargains or discounts.
- b) Before signing any binding document, contact a funeral director of your choice for additional counseling as well as comparative price information. The Federal Trade Commission requires all funeral homes to make service and merchandise prices available to any interested parties.
