



- a) Refrain from hasty or impulsive purchase for the purpose of taking advantage of alleged bargains or discounts.
- b) Before signing any binding document, contact a funeral director of your choice for additional counseling as well as comparative price information. The Federal Trade Commission requires all funeral homes to make service and merchandise prices available to any interested parties.
