H. SCOTT LEFKO

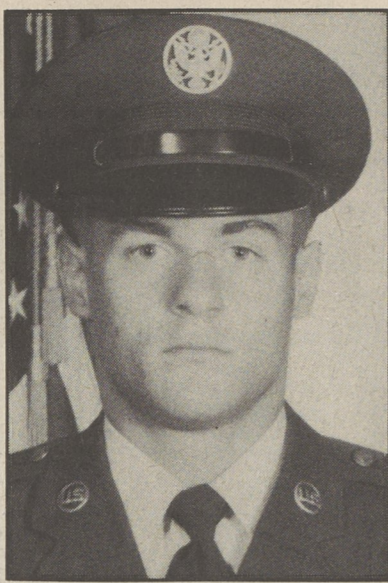
H. Scott Lefko, formerly of Dallas, was recently named director of the new Chesapeake Job Corps Center, in Port Deposit, Maryland.

Ungvasky, his wife Janine and their son, Daniel, reside in Dallas.



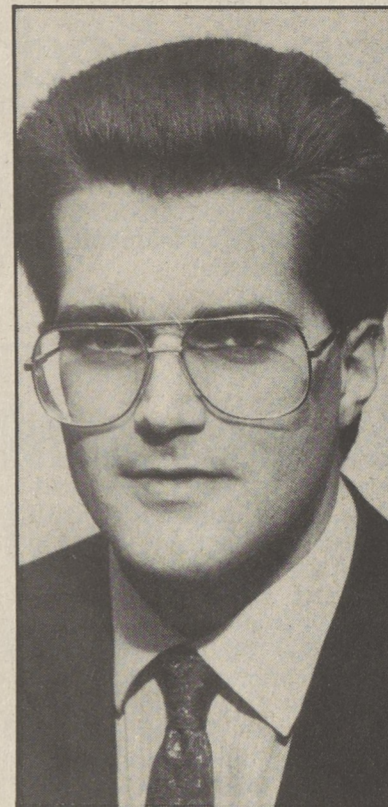
ROSEMARY CAPUTO
