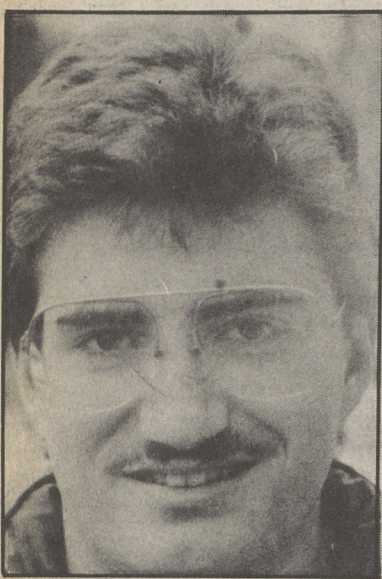

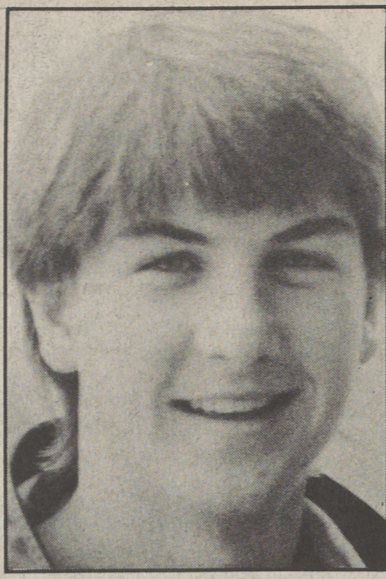

A CONSUMER INFORMATION STATEMENT

It has come to our attention that there may be a group or organization operating in the Greater Wyoming Valley, including the Back Mountain Area, selling caskets and vaults, in advance of need, through telephone solicitation and direct personal contact. The representatives of this group appear not to be licensed funeral directors, and do not seem to represent any particular funeral home in the area. It seems their purpose is to represent a group of investors whose desire it is to retail funeral merchandise to the public outside of the licensed funeral director who is operating a funeral home. While it is perfectly legal under the laws of Pennsylvania for an organization to do so, this same group may not be in a position to render the associated services as well as the care, understanding, and counseling necessary at the time of need.

Should you be contacted by a representative of such an organization, we urge the following:

a) Refrain from hasty or impulsive purchase for the purpose of taking advantage of alleged bargains or discounts.

b) Before signing any binding document, contact a funeral director of your choice for additional counseling as well as comparative price information. The Federal Trade Commission requires all funeral homes to make service and merchandise prices available to any interested parties.
