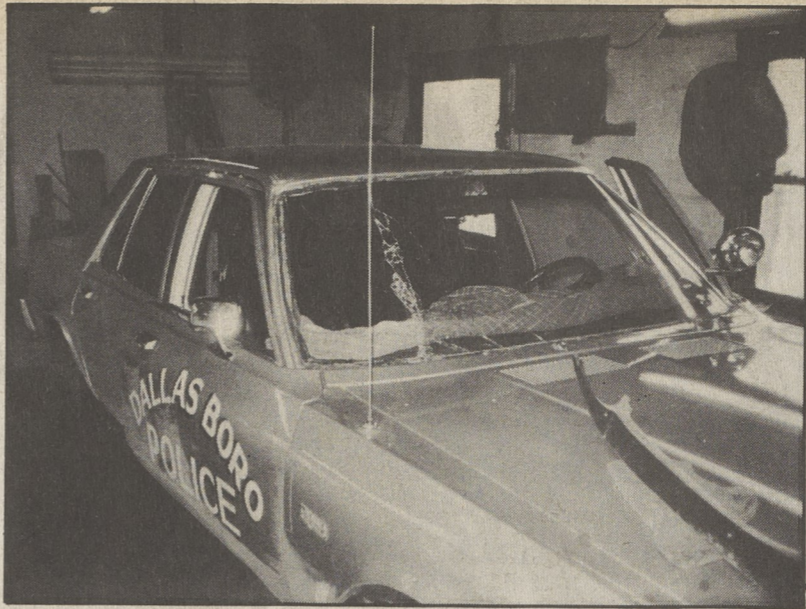
## Michael Traver

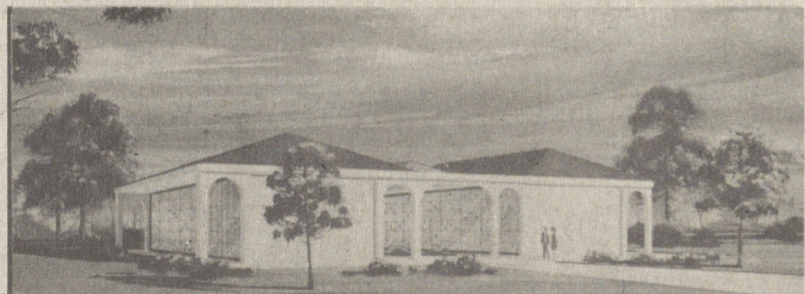
