Miss Pawling is a graduate of Dallas High School and Witten-

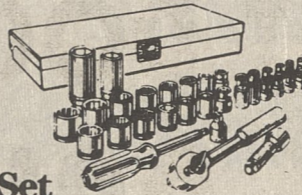
berg University in Springfield, Ohio. A resident of Chevy Chase, Maryland, she is employed as an account executive for Bell Atlantic.

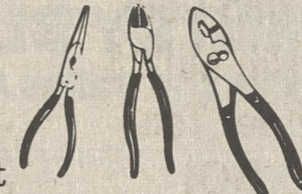

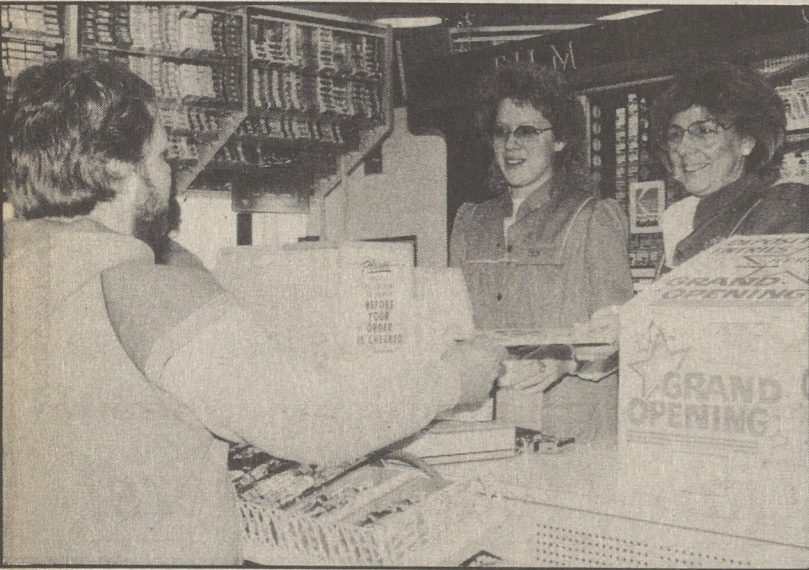
