

According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, portable electric heaters are involved in 240,000 residential fires each year. Most of these were not serious fires, but over 3,000 were attended by the fire service and resulted in 95 deaths and 220 injuries carpeting or rugs.

CPSC safety experts offered the following suggestions for operating portable electric heaters safely:

-Do not use these heaters as a substitute for a central heating system. Portable electric air heaters are designed for temporary heating only.

-Operate the heater at least three feet away from combustible materials, including bedding, home furnishings and objects in the room.

-Always follow warning or cautionary advice provided in labels on the heater, and follow manufacturer's operating instructions provided on or with

-Unless designed for specific



Government safety experts uses, heaters should be used on the floor, never on cabinets, third the injuries resulting from tables, furniture and the like. portable electric heater fires Never use heaters to dry wearing apparel or shoes. Do not place heaters where towels or other combustible materials could fall on the appliance and trigger a fire.

> -Heaters are not intended to be used in wet or moist locations, such as bathrooms. Never locate the heater where it may fall into water.




