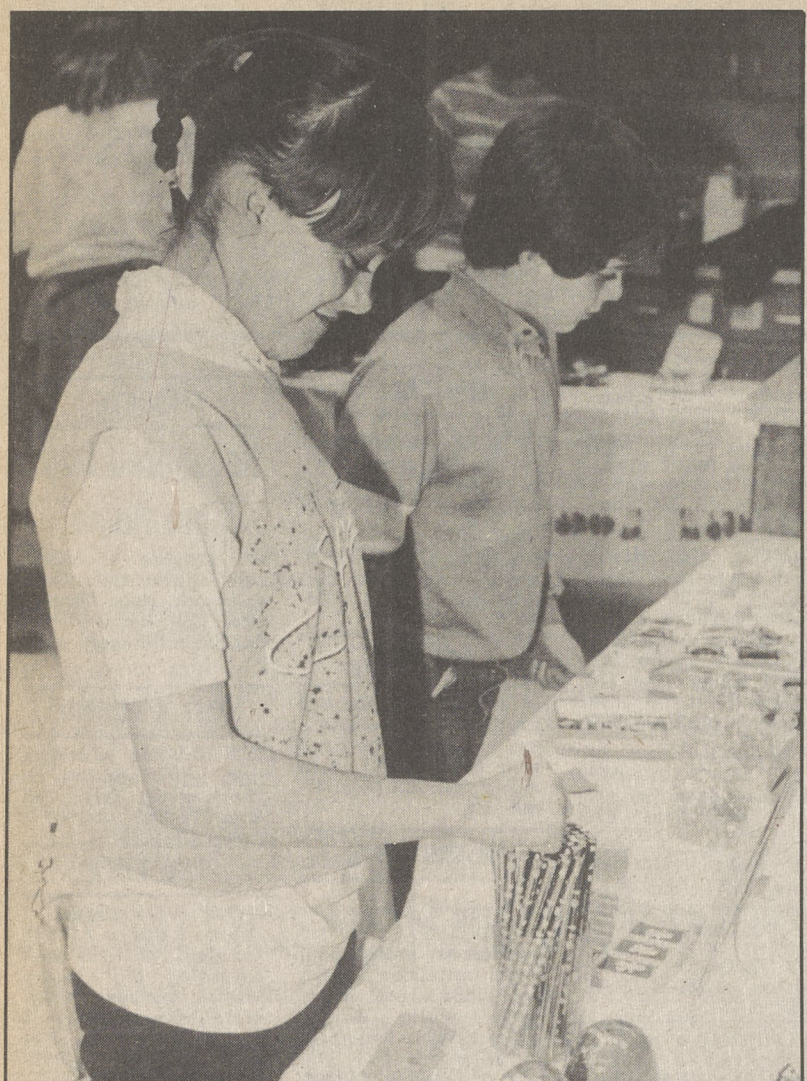


Back Mountain on the move
