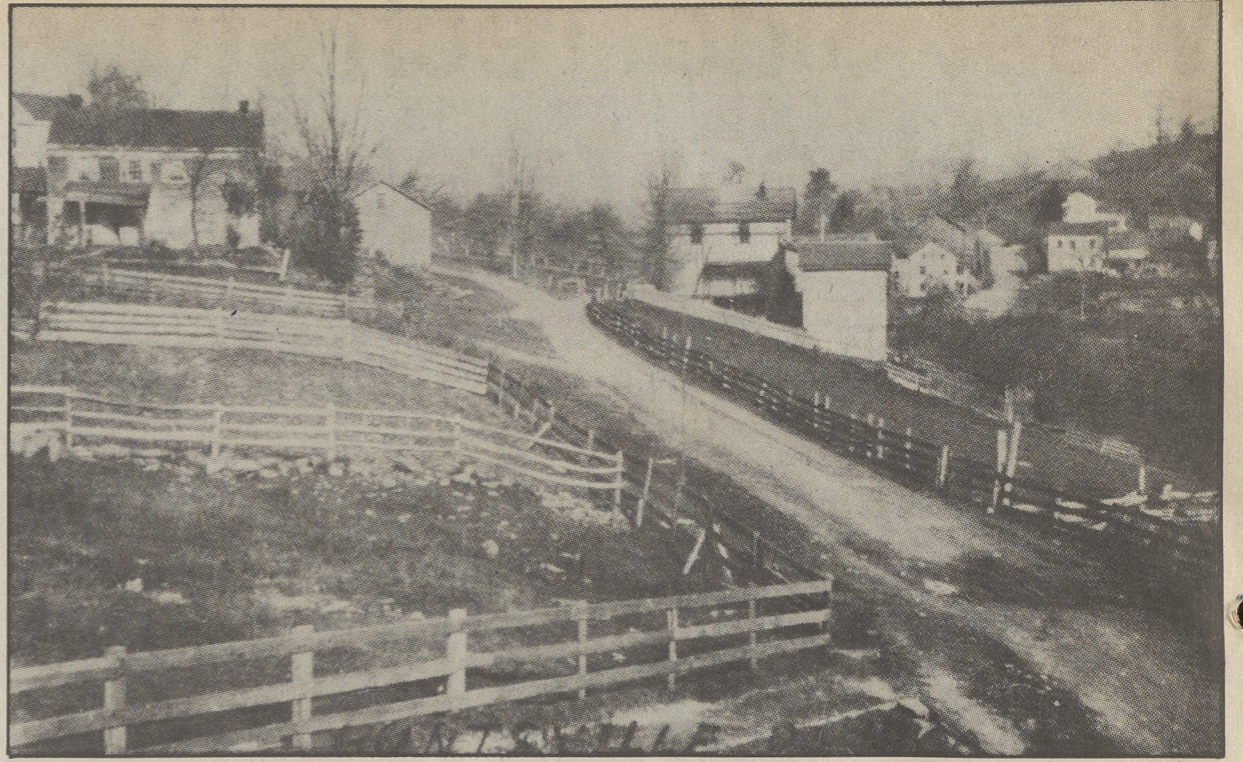

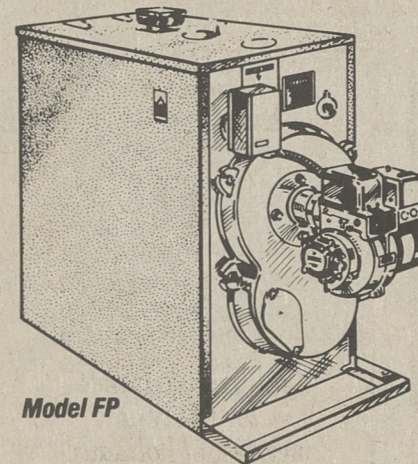
The store has a permanent sale of 25 percent off all bras in stock and 20 percent off all other items.
