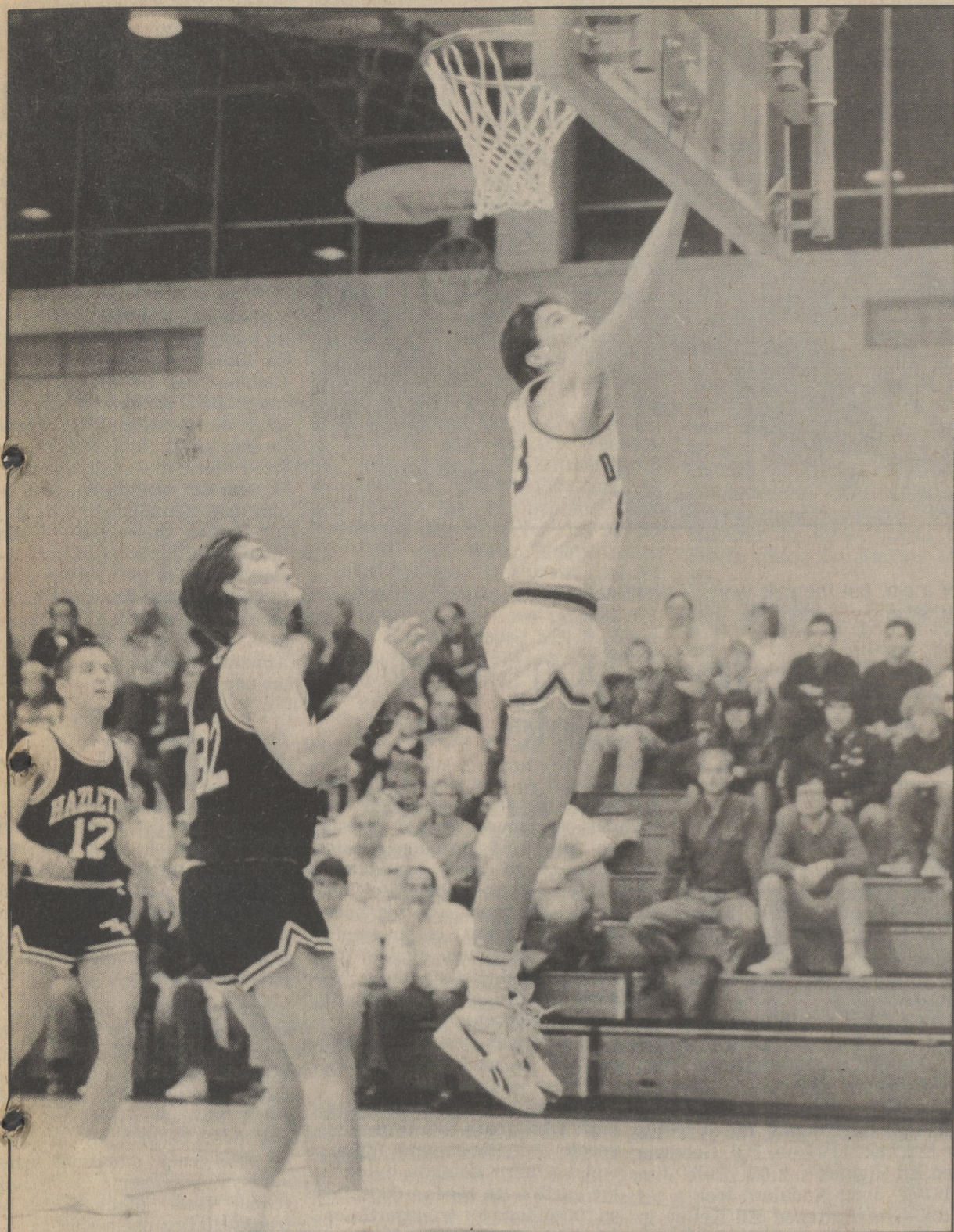

## Dallas loses big to Hazleton Mounts

Hazleton Mountaineers visited the Dallas Mountaineers Friday night and paced by Christian Fornataro and Bob Krizansky easily defeated Dallas 71-45 to take the Division I first half championship.

Fornataro scored 22 points for Hazleton, 18 of them in the first half. He led his team to a 17-12 over the Dallas cagers in the first quarter and scored 11 points in the second quarter to help his Mountaineers outscore Dallas 19-9 to take a 36-21 into the lockerroom at halftime.

Krizansky scored 10 of his 19 points in the first half to help in lengthening the lead. In the fourth quarter Jeff Antolik scored eight points to help his Hazleton teammates outscore Dallas 22-14. Antolik hit the double figure column with 10 points.

High scorer for Dallas was Mike Luksic with 21 points fol-

lowed by Randy Coolbaugh with 12 points. Luksic scored 12 of his points in the second half and Coolbaugh scored eight of his in the second half as they tried to rally their team to come closer to the Hazleton cagers.

In Tuesday's game with Bishop Hoban, the Dallas Mountaineers held a 29-23 lead at halftime but the Argents led by Tom Borum's scoring rallied to outscore the Mountaineers 24-10 in the final quarter to win 62-49.

The Argents trailed the Mountaineers for three quarters, then switched to a full court press to outscore the Mounts 16-4 in the first half of the quarter and reverse the lead to 54-43 in favor of the Argents.

The press by the Argents caused an inexperienced Dallas team to make mistakes and allowed their opponents to collect points.

Lake-Lehman boys basketball team defeated Seton Catholic 66-63 but lost to Northwest when the Rangers came on strong in the third quarter to outscore the Knights 18-4 to take a 39-24 lead Friday night.

Sherrick scored eight points in the third period, two three-point goals. The Rangers took the ball to the outside and made the Knights play the ball enabling the Rangers to score on numerous backdoor layups.

Carl Houck led the Knights with 10 points. The Knights did poor shooting from the foul line making only two-for-seven from the free stripe.

The Knights open the second half, January 29, with GAR at home.
