- 1 STEP** Start with a thorough cleaning. Use Yamaha Mud and Grease Release (P/N: ACC-11001-32-00) to loosen mud, oil, grease and grime for cleaning inside and out. Won't harm paint or rubber. Wash with a mild soap and rinse thoroughly.
- 2 STEP** Lubricate moving parts, suspension linkage and pivot points with Lube-Zall (P/N: ACC-11001-41-01) general purpose lubricant. It fights corrosion while reducing friction.
- 3 STEP** Add Yamaha Fuel Conditioner/Stabilizer (P/N: ACC-11001-45-00) to the fuel tank. It prevents fuel oxidation, gum and varnish deposits and inhibits corrosion in the carburetor and fuel system for up to one year. Draining the fuel system for storage is no longer necessary when this product is used! Regular use cleans the carburetor and fuel system while you ride!
- 4 STEP** Use Yamaha Stor-Rite Fogging Oil (P/N: ACC-11001-47-00) to coat internal engine parts. It helps prevent rust and corrosion due to moisture and acidic combustion residue in 2-cycle engines during extended storage periods. With the engine warm and idling, spray Yamaha Stor-Rite Engine Fogging Oil into the airbox for 20-30 seconds. This procedure produces a large quantity of smoke, so be sure you perform this procedure outside!
- 5 STEP** Apply Silicone Spray (P/N: ACC-11001-46-00) to the entire engine, track and other metal, rubber and plastic parts. This will retard rust and salt corrosion, prevent plastic and rubber parts from deterioration, cracking and gumming. Additionally, Silicone Spray helps stop sticking, binding and squeaking.

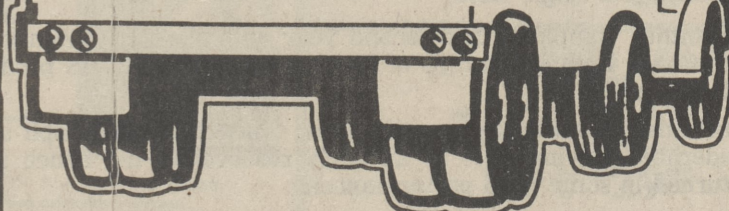
