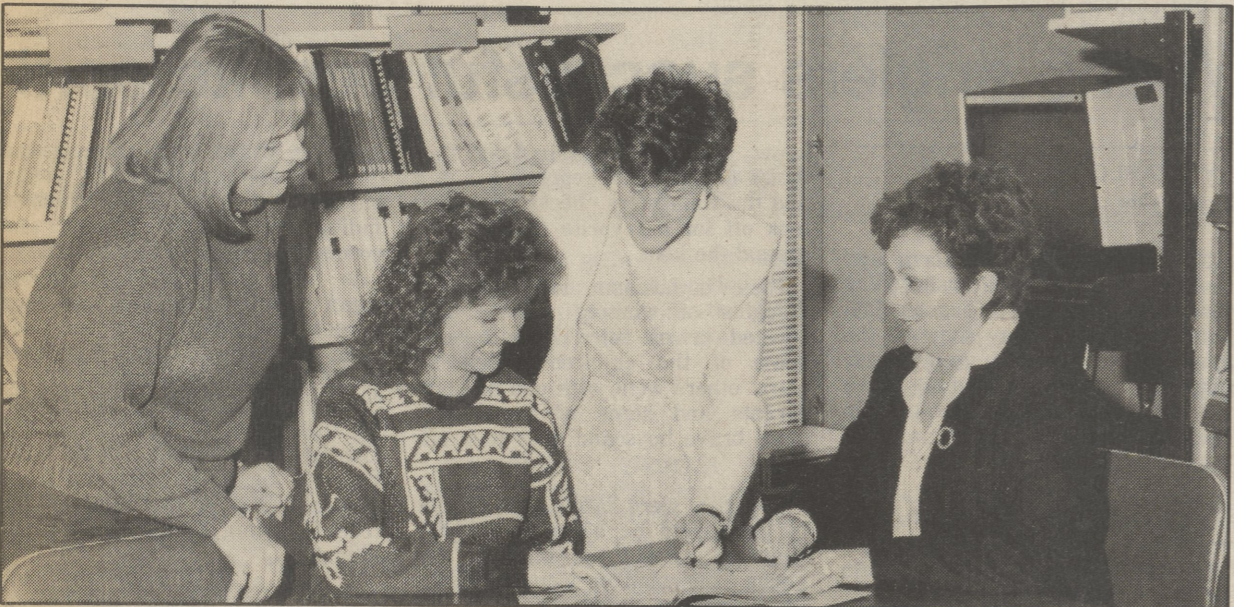
"Charlotte's Web" performed
