Student aid deadline set

Scott Dietterick said Rep. recently that the 1988-89 filing deadline for all students seeking to renew their aid from the Pennsylvania State Farm Grant is May 1.

The deadline applies regardless of the student's program of study and applies for all the applicants who plan to enroll in bachelor degree programs including those enrolling in college transfer programs at two-year community or junior colleges.

Individuals seeking aid for the first time and planning to enroll in business or trade schools, hospital schools of nursing or two-year vocational (non-transferable) programs at community or junior colleges have until Aug. 1 to file their state grant applications.


