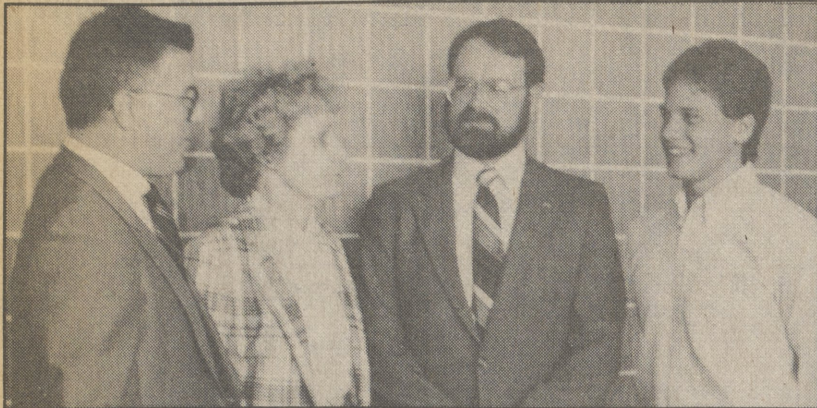

Host families needed for foreign students

Host families are needed for a group of French, Spanish, and German exchange students who will be arriving in the area this summer for a one-month homestay with an American family. The first group of foreign exchange students arrives on July 26 and departs on August 23.

Participation in the summer hosting program involves sharing home and family life with a French, Spanish, or German student, ages 13-18 for a period of four weeks. The students all speak English, bring their own spending money, and the organization provides comprehensive medical, accident, and liability insurance as well as transportation to the host family.

The coordinators are looking for average American families willing to share their everyday activities with the exchange students for one month and to treat the student as a member of the family and not as a guest. Families with teenage children, families without children, as well as families with younger children are encouraged to apply.

Also needed are families willing to host one of the teacher-chaperones who will accompany the students. They are teachers of English in France, Spain and Germany.

The exchange students are anxious to discover American family life, to attend a family picnic, to watch an American baseball game, and to share in your everyday activities.

Nacel Cultural Exchanges is also seeking American students ages 13-18, who would like to spend one month living with a foreign family in France, Spain, Germany or the Ivory Coast or to participate in study seminars in England, Ireland and France.

Nacel Cultural Exchanges is a non-profit educational organization and is listed with the National Association of Secondary School Principals, the Council on Standards for International Education Travel, and the President's International Youth Exchange Initiative. The coordinators are college professors of modern languages.

Student aid deadline set

Rep. Scott Dieterick said recently that the 1988-89 filing deadline for all students seeking to renew their aid from the Pennsylvania State Farm Grant is May 1.

The deadline applies regardless of the student's program of study and applies for all the applicants who plan to enroll in bachelor degree programs including those enrolling in college transfer programs at two-year community or junior colleges.

Individuals seeking aid for the first time and planning to enroll in business or trade schools, hospital schools of nursing or two-year vocational (non-transferable) programs at community or junior colleges have until Aug. 1 to file their state grant applications.

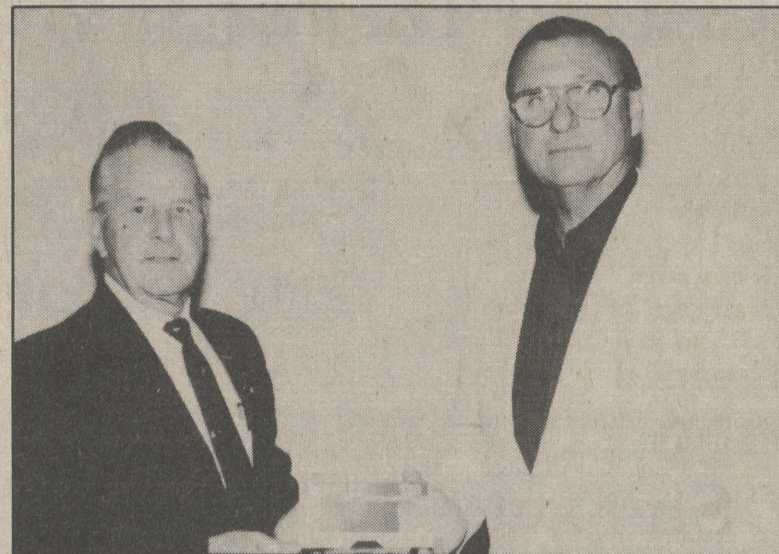
