

Amendment will change aid formula

The Housing and Community Development Subcommittee has adopted an amendment offered by U.S. Congressman Paul E. Kanjorski (D-PA) requiring that long-term unemployment data be used to determine eligibility for federal Emergency Food and Shelter Program funding.

Under the current funding formula used by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which administers the program, data on the number of

long-term unemployed individuals is not used in determining whether an area qualifies for funding.

"When we are trying to target funds for emergency food and shelter to areas of greatest need, it is ridiculous to not count people who have been unemployed for so long that their unemployment benefits have run out," Kanjorski said in describing the amendment. "In many cases, these are the people most in need of this assistance."

Without the formula change

required under Kanjorski's amendment, homeless assistance programs in Luzerne County stand to lose all future funding under the Emergency Food and Shelter Program because the county's unemployment rate - without counting the long-term unemployed - has dropped under the 9 percent eligibility requirement.

Citing information provided by United Way of Wyoming Valley, with whom Kanjorski has been working in drafting his amend-

ment, the Congressman noted, "If long-term unemployed people in the county were counted, the real unemployment figure would probably be closer to 15 percent. This clearly shows a need for continued funding."

In the first five funding rounds of the program, Luzerne County received an average of \$187,000. In one round in 1987, the County received \$242,545 and provided 66,271 meals and 64,141 nights of lodging-utilities.

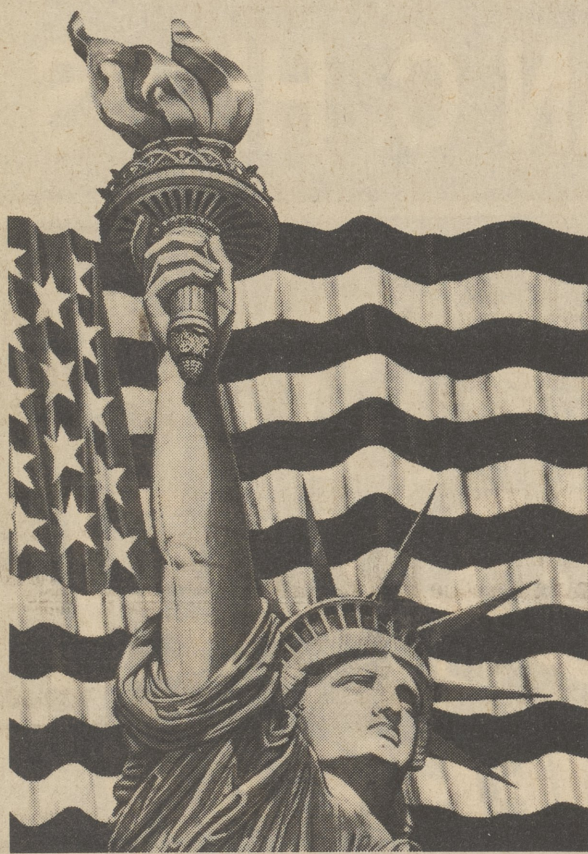
