Appointments may be made by calling 288-1411, extension 4447, Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

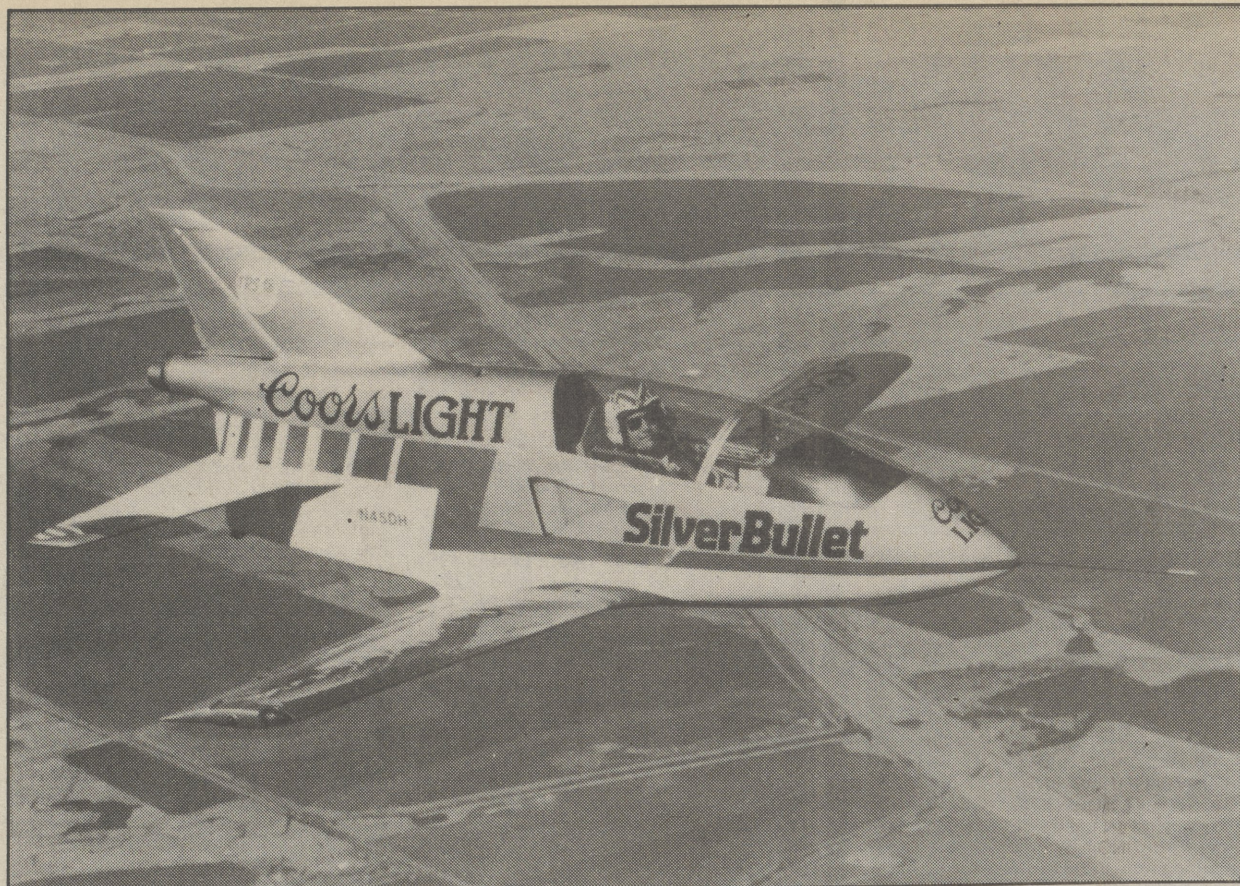

Airshow '88 coming to W-B/Scranton Airport

The world's smallest jet aircraft, the Coors Light Silver Bullet, will be performing in Airshow '88, June 25 and 26 at the Wilkes-Barre-Scranton International Airport.

Sponsored by L.T. Verrastro Distributors, this full transportable jet can be dismantled in less than 20 minutes and will fit through a 4 1/2 foot door.

Airshow '88 will also include performances by Team America, a precision aerobatics team; The Six of Diamonds, flying World War II aircraft; a parachute demonstration by the U.S. Navy Leapfrogs; the Fouga Magister, a jet trainer and light attack aircraft and Oscar Boesch's Sailplane "Wings of

Man". A variety of aircraft and exhibits will be available for inspection including the Boeing B-17 Flying Fortress, fighter aircraft, helicopters, cargo planes, trucks and tanks. Crews will be on hand to answer all questions.

Air Show hours are daily from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. with flight demonstrations scheduled for 1 p.m. Ticket prices are \$6.00 for adults, \$3.00 for children six through 12, and under 6 free. Expanded free parking is provided at the airport and at Rocky Glen Park off Interstate 81 at Exit 50. Free shuttle buses will take spectators to the air show gates.
