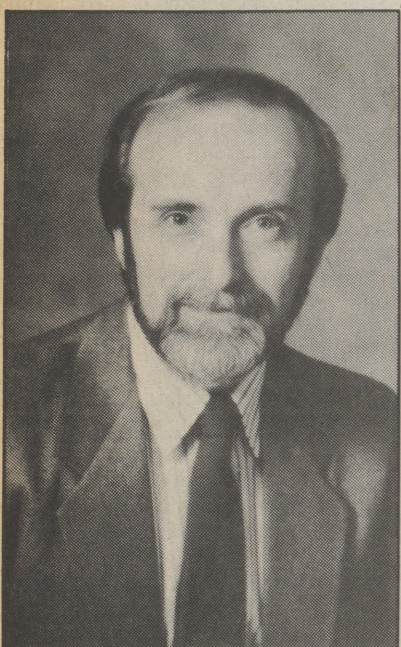


Eight join Mount Nittany Society
