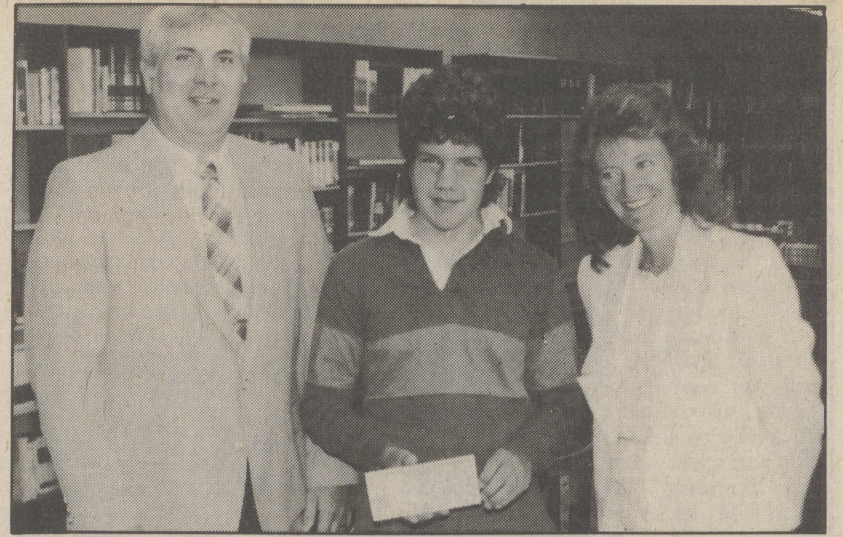
### Back Mountain students make LCCC honors

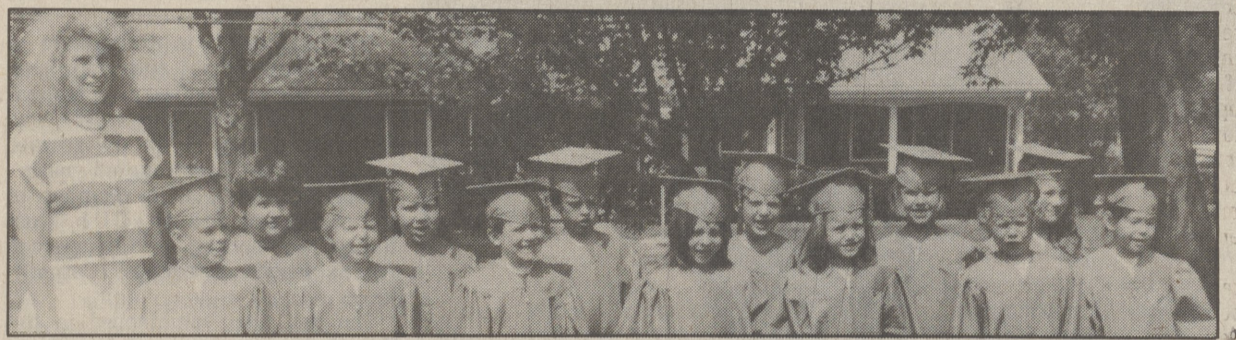


### Moses wins essay contest

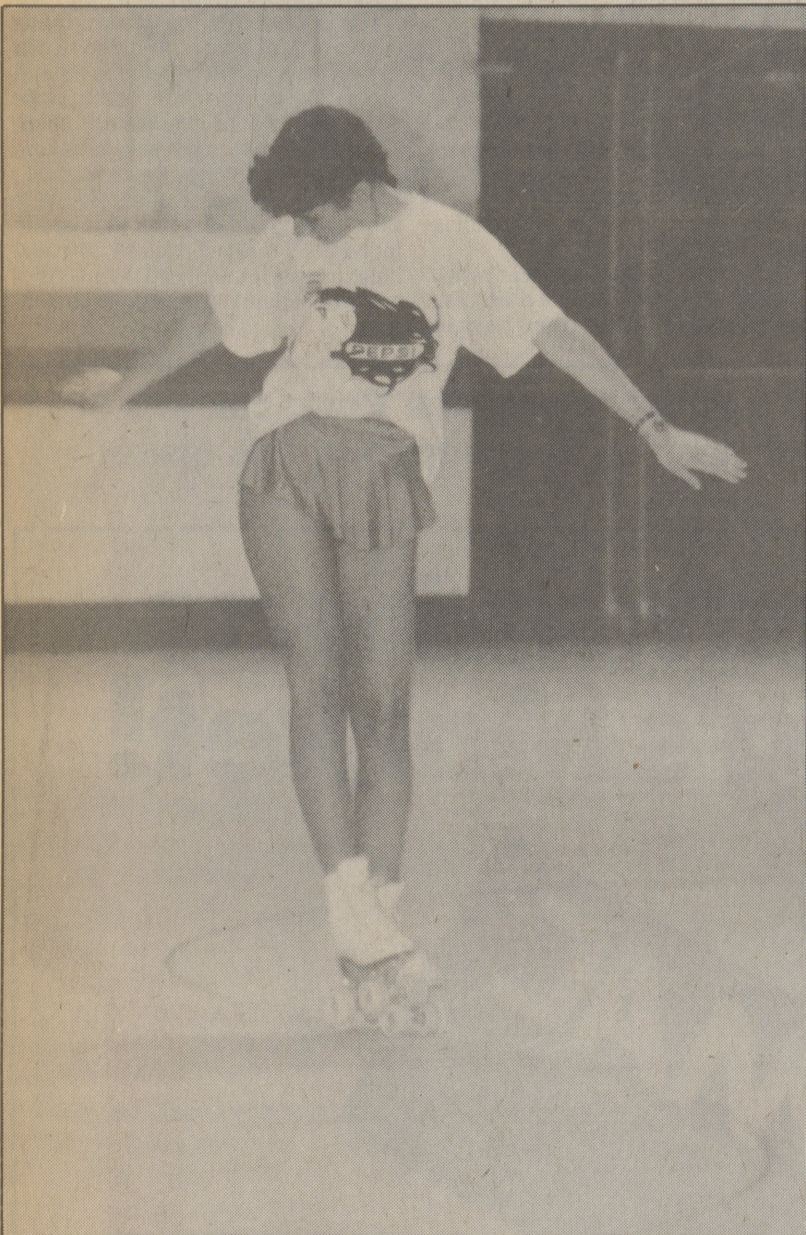
