Three freshmen students at the Penn State Wilkes-Barre campus were honored for outstanding academic achievements in University-wide ceremonies held recently at State College. Joseph Cunningham, of Exeter; Melanie Molnar, of Athens; Bradford County; and Scott Pearson, of Sweet Valley, were named recipients of Presidential Freshman Awards.

The University-wide awards are presented annually to those undergraduate students who have carried full-time credit load and earned 4.0 grade point averages for the first semester of their freshman year. The three were among 89 Presidential award recipients recognized by University President Dr. Bryce Jordan during a special honors convocation attended by Dr. James

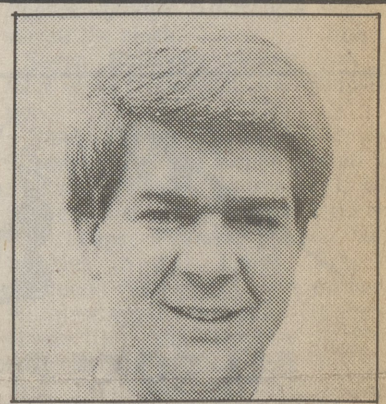
Misericordia Dean's List
