The Kingston Township Board of Supervisors will participate in a special dedication ceremony on Sunday, Sept. 4, at 3 p.m. in the Kingston Township Municipal Building, 11 Carverton Road, Trucksville, to accept from Mr. and Mrs. Wiener, Jr., a decorative fountain which has been erected at the Municipal Building in memory of their son Mark.

Mark B. Wiener was a resident of Trucksville until his death in 1987, from Bone Cancer. At the time of his death, Mark was serving as Public Relations Director for the Committee for Economic Growth (C.E.G.). As Public Relations Director, Mark brought much needed

recognition to our area through the production of a special video entitled "Greater Wilkes-Barre, You Should See Us Now." Mr. Wiener played a major role in having Money Magazine rank our region as the "Ninth best place in the United States to live." He was held in high esteem by his colleagues for his efforts to spur the economic recovery of our region.

A graduate of Dallas High School, Mr. Wiener received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science and English, graduating with honors from Juniata College in 1979. He also attended Warmbrough College in Oxford, England.

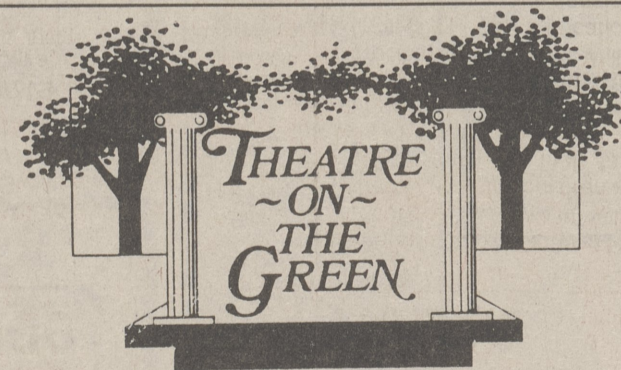

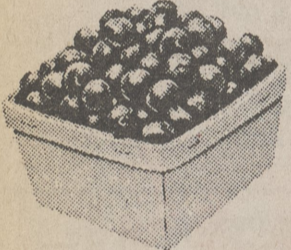
