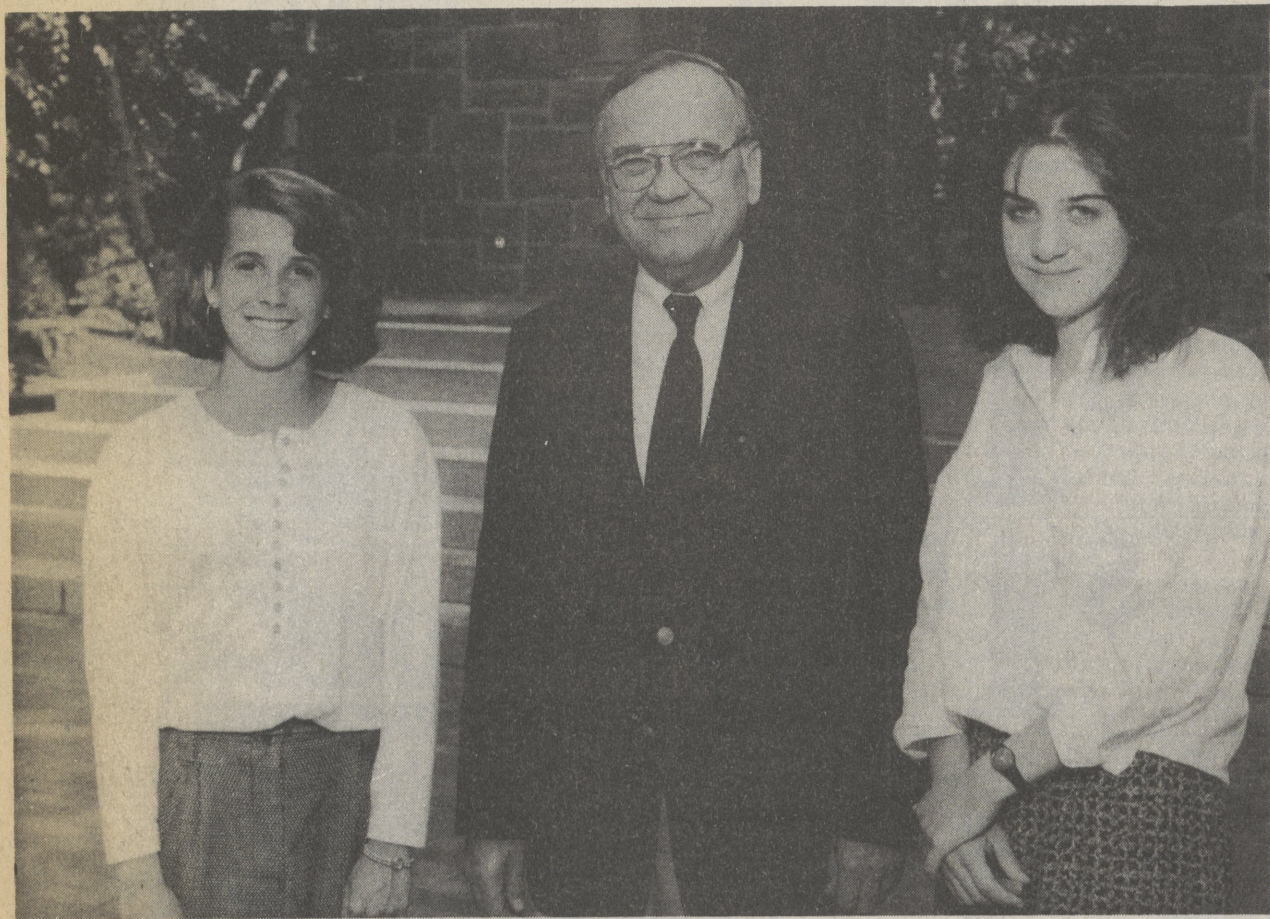

## Joanna Garbush will attend British school as exchange student

Joanna Garbush, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Garbush, Shavertown, will spend the first trimester of her junior year as a student at the Kingswood School in Bath, England. Sara Tanner, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Brian Tanner, Avon, England, will be attending Wyoming Seminary during the fall term. Garbush and Tanner are the third students from their respective institutions to be involved in the

exchange program.

In the fall of 1985 Laurie Campbell, the Headmaster of the Kingswood School at that time, was a guest at Wyoming Seminary. The Kingswood School was the first school founded by John Wesley in 1749 and is the mother institution for more than 135 schools, colleges, universities and theological schools related to the United Methodist

Church in the United States.

During the 1985 visit of Campbell, an agreement was reached for an exchange of students. Last year Steven Sours, son of Dr. and Mrs. Richard Sours, Kingston, attended Kingswood and in the initial year of the program Juliana Koo, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Wook Hun Koo, Dallas, was the Seminary student to travel abroad.

## Reading and math programs in Lake-Lehman district

The ECIA Chapter I Reading and Math programs are currently underway at the Lake-Lehman School District. Students will be screened with the Metropolitan Achievement Test for Math, and the Gates-MacGinitie Test for Reading.

Any student who qualifies for instruction based on the screening tests is then tested individually for specific problems. Results of these tests will be used to develop a prescription for each child's individual needs. The child will then be placed in a small class to receive approximately 30 minutes of individual and/or group instruction per day.

Supervisor for the ECIA programs is Patricia Peiffer. Reading Specialists are Ed Ladamus, Jeanne Swainberg, Molly Crossin, Gerald Gizenski, Sandra Strickland, Sheila Race, and Jud Holdredge. Math instructors are Debbie Noon, Terry Platkowski, Sandra Strickland, Maureen Doerfler, Cindy Harrison and Louise Schwartz.

A variety of materials is available for teacher and student use in the ECIA programs. In addition to books, duplicating masters, manipulatives, and machinery, the use of computers and software has become an integral part of both the Math and Reading programs.

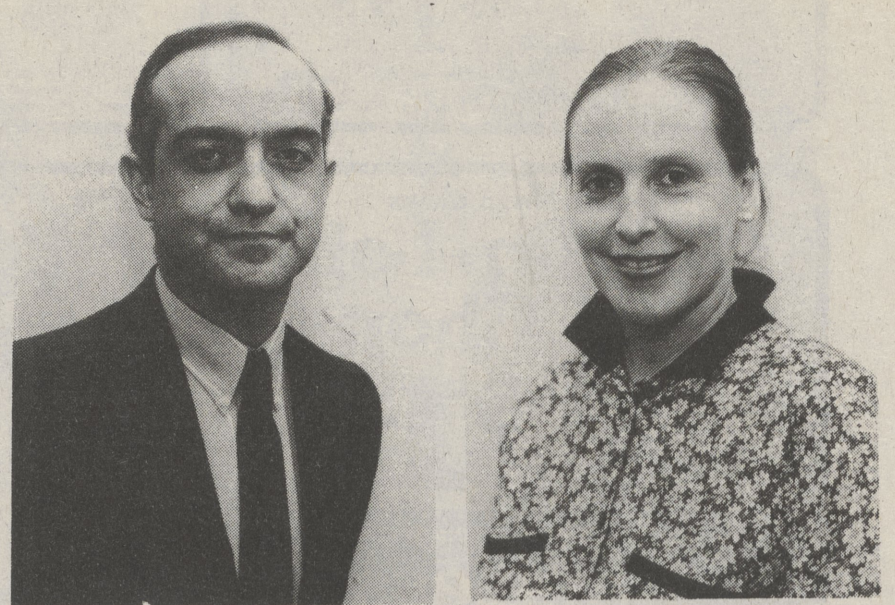

## New faculty join Penn State Wilkes-Barre

New faculty members are on the staff at Penn State Wilkes-Barre, according to Dr. James H. Ryan, campus executive officer. They are M.R. Nouri-Moghadam, Ph.D., as-sociate professor of mathematics; and Linda Quinn, Ph.D., instructor of psychology.

Dr. M.R. Nouri-Moghadam, new associate professor of mathematics, received a B.S. from the University of London, and served as a Research Fellow at the mathematics department of King's College University of London until 1976. During that time, he earned a Ph.D. in Applied Mathematics.

His awards and honors include being a recipient of the Distinguished Fellowship in Science and Research Fellowship at King's College and the University of London. Dr. Nouri-Moghadam most recently was elected Research Associate of the International Center for Theoretical and Mathematical Physics.

Dr. Nouri-Moghadam has been invited to speak about his research at universities in Europe, Japan, and the USA, and has chaired the math-physics section of the American Mathematical Society's annual conference.

He and his wife Vida have two children and live in the Back Mountain.

Dr. Linda Sandham Quinn, new

instructor of psychology, comes to Penn State Wilkes-Barre from San Jose, California, where she was a lecturer at San Jose State University. She holds a Ph.D. in experimental child psychology from the University of Nebraska - Lincoln, and both an M.A. and a B.A. in psychology from San Jose State University.

While in San Jose, Dr. Quinn has also served as a staff consultant for the Tragon Corporation in Redwood City, California. She has also served as auditor of animal studies at the ALZA Corporation in Palo Alto, California, where she audited all pharmaceutical animal studies to ensure compliance with Food and Drug Administration regulations.

She is a member of the American Psychological Association, the Western Psychological Association, and the Society for Research in Child Development. She has four publications to her credit, including articles she has written for the *Bulletin of the Psychonomic Society*, 1982 and 1984, and for *Psychological Reports*, 1987. She has made numerous presentations at national meetings of the Western Psychological Association, and at the Society for Research in Child Development.

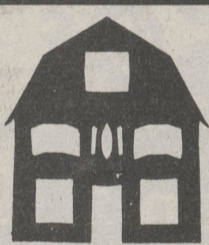
Lake-Lehman is the 1987 Cavalcade of Bands Pennsylvania State

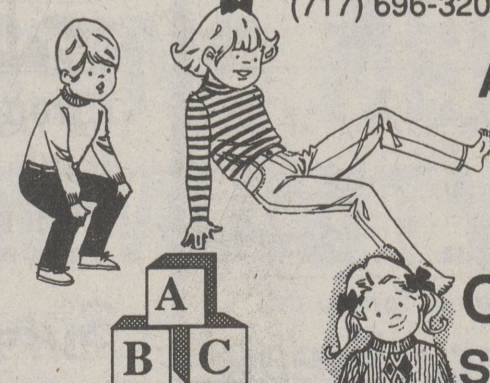
