High school students Erin Brady and Karen White were congratulated by the board for being designated as Commended Students in the National Merit Scholarship program.

The board members approved the appointment of Marilyn Neifert, Lake-Noxen cafeteria worker, to the position of cafeteria manager in the same building to replace Joy Schuler, who resigned. Mrs. Neifert's hours will increase from six to six and a half hours daily and she will receive an additional 25 cents per hour as manager. Kathryn Short was approved as a three hour cafeteria worker at the Lake-Noxen School at an hourly rate of \$3.55. Catherine Daubert of Trucksville and Cynthia Sutton of Lehman were

approved as cafeteria substitutes.

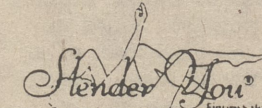

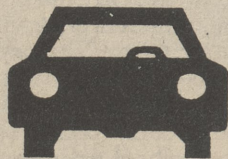
