

## Construction begins on Penn State technology center

S.G. Mastriani Construction Company, contractors for the \$3.5 million Penn State Wilkes-Barre Center for Technology, began construction on the project Monday.

Campus executive officer James H. Ryan introduced Ralph Mancuso, executive vice president for Mastriani, at a news conference Monday morning with bulldozers beginning work in the background. Atty. Mi-

chael Hudacek, chairman of the community campaign that raised money to finance the facility was also present.

According to Dr. Ryan, the new center will house laboratories for electrical engineering technology, mechanical engineering technololgy, telecommunications technology, biomedial engineering, robotics, and computer aided design, a teleconference auditorium and an astronomy dome.


for industry information in the engineering and engineering technology fields.

Bids from seven contractors from throughout the Commonwealth were received by Penn State and Mastriani was the lowest qualified bidder. "We are pleased that a firm from this region is building our center," Dr. Ryan said.

The Mastriani Co. of Scranton is one of the oldest contractors in the region. It was founded in 1946 by Samuel Mastriani and the company has performed work throughout the five-state Mid-Atlantic region. Mrs. Lorraine Cestone, Mastriani's daughter, took over as president when her father died this summer.

Mastriani Company has built projects for Penn State in other locations and also for the Pennsylvania State School Authority, and projects for numerous other colleges such as Mansfield State College, Kutztown State College, Lock Haven State College, University of Scranton, Marywood College and Luzerne County Community College, where they constructed a laboratory class building.

"Today is one of the happiest days for me to actually see the construction get underway," said Atty. Hudacek. "This building was made possible by the hard work of close to a hundred volunteers who brought the community together for what they knew was a worthwhile project. This new center will benefit the entire region as a resource for technology information. It will make the quality of life better for all of us and our children's children.
