Commonwealth Telephone Com- building will house approximately 200 employees from the company's Data Processing and Accounting Departments.

In announcing the \$5 million project, Jack H. Thomas, executive vice president, said the 52,000 square-foot building is scheduled for completion in July 1989. Commonwealth has contracted with Pyros and Sanderson Architects of the Quad Three Group, Inc., Wilkes-Barre, to oversee design, engineering, and construction of the build-

Currently, the Data Processing and Accounting Departments are located at the company's headquarters on Lake Street in Dallas. 




