Susan Wells selected for Daughters of the American Revolution Citizens Award

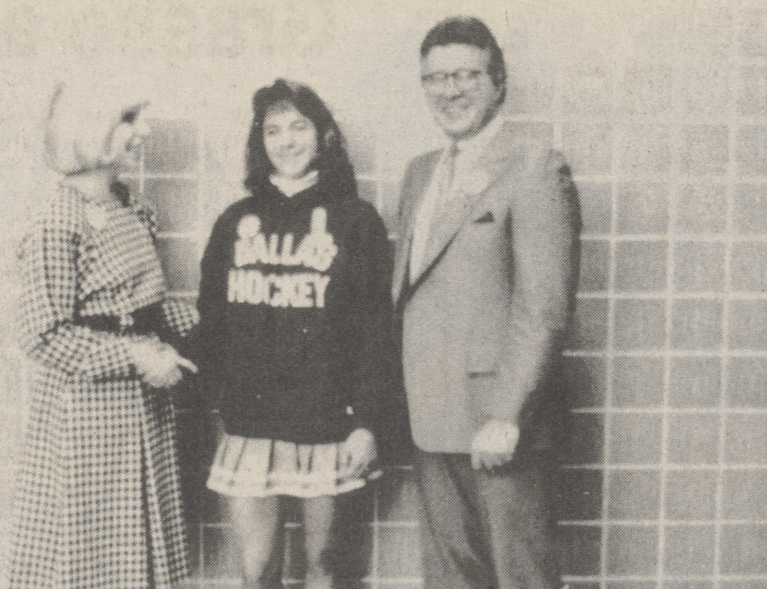

Lake-Lehman High Band wins third year Atlantic Coast Championship

The Lake-Lehman High School Band has won the Atlantic Coast Championship in field show competition for the 3rd straight year.

The Tournament of Bands championship competition was held in Allentown this past weekend where 100 of the best high school marching bands from New York to North Carolina competed for the honor of being crowned the best field show band on the Atlantic Coast.

This championship competition has bands competing in four groups depending on their size. Lehman competes in Group II, having 54 musicians and 38 band front and auxiliary members.

Lehman scored a 96.9 out of 100 points to best the field of 25 marching bands in their group. However, when the final judging was completed for all groups, Lehman's score was the highest awarded by the judges. No band in a smaller class has ever been awarded the judges' highest score. This achievement has never been accomplished by any other band in previous championship competitions.

Awards were also presented in special categories. Lehman took their group's awards for best music, best brass, best wind and reeds and best marching and maneuvering. They brought home a total of six first place trophies.

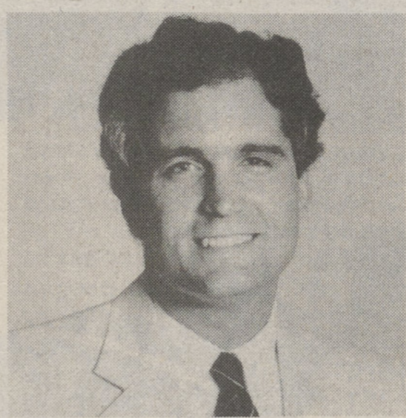
Hadzor promoted to Vice President position
