Mrs. Hughes resided in Jackson Township for the past 20 years, and before that, had resided in Dallas Township for 14 years.


She was a graduate of the former Edwardsville High School and was also a graduate of Bloomsburg State Teachers College.

2 car accident


Dallas Township Officer John Appel on November 28 was called to the scene of an accident on Lake Street in front of Mercy Medical Center.
